


I would like to welcome everyone to the second annual awards banquet sponsored by the Central Pennsylvania Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame.

PROCEDURE FOR THE SELECTION OF THE SCHOLAR-ATHLETES

As the scholastic football season came to a close, a representative of the Central Pennsylvania Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame sent a letter and nomination form to each of the 30 high school principals and football coaches represented by the Central Pennsylvania Chapter. Each principal and head coach then submitted a resume of the qualifications of the selected candidate. The resume included a high school transcript, test scores (SAT/ACT), athletic achievements, extra-curricular activities and community service participation.

The resumes were forwarded to the Selection Committee. The Selection Committee was composed of knowledgeable representatives from the athletic, educational and business communities. It was the responsibility of the Selection Committee to follow the guidelines established by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. The following was the basis for selection:

40% Academic Achievement

40% Athletic Achievement


20% Extracurricular/Community Service Activities

Scholar Athlete on a Successful Season.

PRESIDENT OF NATIONAL FOOTBALL FOUNDATION ROBERT F. CASCIOLA

In December of 1995, Bob Casciola became President of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame, after serving as Executive Director since August of 1991. In his role as President, he oversees over 104 chapters with over 10,000 members throughout the country.

For 20 years, Bob was involved in college football as an Assistant Coach at Princeton University and Dartmouth College and then as Head Coach at the University of Connecticut and Princeton.

In 1978, he joined First Fidelity Bank of New Jersey and rose to Senior Vice President, leaving in 1987 to become Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer of the New Jersey Nets of the National Basketball Association.

Since his active coaching days, Bob has remained very active in sports circles in a wide variety of roles. For fourteen years, he coordinated the coaching at the nationally known Quarterback-Receiver Camp, had been a member of the selection committee of the Garden State Bowl and now serves on the Executive Committee of the Kickoff Classic in the Meadowlands.

Since 1981, he has done color analysis on Princeton Football. In 1983, Bob was chosen to do color commentary by WOR-Radio in New York for the New Jersey Generals of the USFL and was cited in 1983 as the best sports reporting team in New York State. In the Fall of 1984, he became the "voice" of Rutgers Football on both radio and television and continues to do color commentating on New Jersey Network covering Rutgers, Princeton and the state colleges in New Jersey.

During the 1985 and 1986 seasons, Bob served as color analyst for the Ivy League Game of the Week on National Public Television. In addition, his broadcasting career has included color commentary for the Mizlou Television Network working the Independence Bowl in 1985, 1986, and 1987; the Hall of Fame Bowl in 1986 and the Senior Bowl in 1988. From the Fall of 1987 through 1990, Casciola was color commentator for the Great American Independent Football Broadcasts on National Television that included the following schools: Boston College, Syracuse, Pittsburgh, West Virginia, Notre Dame, Temple, Rutgers, Army and Navy. Since 1991, Bob has served as color analyst for Rutgers and Princeton Football on New Jersey Network Television and Comcast Cable Network.


For his efforts with New Jersey high school football, Casciola received the Coaches Association Honor Award in 1981, and on June 5, 1984 was cited for his contribution to high school sports by the Delaware Valley Chapter of The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame, receiving the Distinguished American Award. In the Fall of 1985, he was honored by the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority for his efforts on behalf of Athletics in New Jersey. In 1990, The New Jersey Tournament of Champions selected Bob as "Person of the Year", and in 1994, the Downtown Athletic Club honored him with Heisman Scholarship Award in special recognition for his outstanding and significant achievements in college football.

BIOGRAPHY OF TODD BLACKLEDGE

Todd Blackledge, a seven year veteran of the National Football League, joined ABC Sports in 1994 as an expert analyst for college football. In 1996, he was moved into the studio alongside of John Saunders to provide analysis during ABC's halftime and postgame shows.

In addition to his Saturday afternoon studio duties, Blackledge also serves as a color analyst in the booth for ESPN's Thursday night college football package.

A former quarterback in the NFL, Blackledge played for the Kansas City Chiefs from 1983-88 and with the Pittsburgh Steelers from 1988-90.



Prior to joining ABC, Blackledge worked as a college football analyst for the Big East Television Network and for ESPN. He has also served as the analyst for the Indianapolis Colts preseason games (1993-96) and the Philadelphia Eagles (1997-present).

Blackledge was an academic All-American and earned Phi Beta Kappa status as a



junior at Penn State in addition to being the team's starting quarterback for three seasons. He guided the Nittany Lions to a 31-5 record and three New Year's Day Bowl victories including the 1983 Sugar Bowl in which Penn State beat Georgia and captured the National Championship.

In the Spring of 1997, Blackledge was elected to the Academic All-American Hall of Fame, with Penn State football coach Joe Paterno serving as his presenter.

Todd and his wife, Cherie, have two sons, Harrison, born May 28, 1995, and Quinn, born May 12, 1997. The Blackledges reside in Canton, Ohio.

Attended Juniata College 1956 - 60, graduated June 1960, history / math major.

Three time All American football player. Started varsity baseball 4 years and signed a professional baseball contract with the Los Angeles Dodgers in June 1960. Played Triple A baseball before becoming a Minor League manager. Managed 12 years for the Los Angeles Dodgers minor league system. Won the championship 5 out of the 12 years managing a farm team. Named League Manager of the Year 5 out of the 12 years.

From September 1961 to May 1977 he worked as an Associate Dean of Students at Juniata College. In April 1977 he became the Athletic Director at Juniata College and as of June 1996 remains as head baseball coach and intramural director.

On May 3, 1996 he was elected into the (Harrisburg Chapter) of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame.

For 28 years he has served on the Huntingdon Community Center Board. Served as president for 10 of those 28 years.

For two years served as president of the Middle Atlantic Athletic Conference.
