

Biography Ron Pavlechko

Ron is presently Director of Athletics for the State College Area School District in charge of directing forty-four sport teams.

Most recently he taught English and was the Head Football Coach at State College Area High School for nineteen years. During this time his teams recorded notable achievements. The 1981 and 1992 teams were undefeated during the regular season and the '92 squad was a state semi-finalist. Four P.I.A.A. District VI championships were earned. In 1984 Ron was selected as the head coach of the West team for the Pennsylvania Big 33 Game held in Johnstown. In 1987 and 1990 he was an assistant coach for the North team in the Uni-Mart Football Classic game (now the Lezzer Lumber Classic). In 1990 The Pennsylvania State Football Coaches Association recognized Ron for coaching 100 victories and in 1999 the Central Pennsylvania Football Coaches Association inducted him into their Hall of Fame.

Ron served as an assistant football coach, responsible for the offensive line, at SCAHS from 1971 through 1976. During this time State College won 36 straight games and was declared the 1973 state champion. He was chosen as an assistant coach for the 1973 Pennsylvania Big 33 team.

Ron lettered as an offensive lineman at Penn State from 1967 through 1970. He was a member of Joe Paterno's second recruiting class and played in two Orange Bowls.

A graduate of Austintown-Fitch High School in Youngstown, Ohio, Ron played in the 1967 Ohio All-Star football game.

PROCEDURE FOR THE SELECTION OF THE SCHOLAR-ATHLETES

As the scholastic football season came to a close, a representative of the Central Pennsylvania Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame sent a letter and nomination form to each of the 30 high school principals and football coaches represented by the Central Pennsylvania Chapter. Each principal and head coach then submitted a resume of the qualifications of the selected candidate. The resume included a high school transcript, test scores (SAT/ACT), athletic achievements, extra-curricular activities and community service participation.

The resumes were forwarded to the Selection Committee. The Selection Committee was composed of knowledgeable representatives from the athletic, educational and business communities. It was the responsibility of the Selection Committee to follow the guidelines established by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. The following was the basis for selection:

40% Academic Achievement

40% Athletic Achievement

20% Extracurricular/Community Service Activities

The resumes were carefully evaluated and rank ordered. The names were given to the Advisory Board. The Advisory Board determined the number of scholarships to be presented to the nominees.

Executive Director at College Football Hall of Fame



Jerry Sandusky Biography

Long-time defensive coordinator Jerry Sandusky retired following the 1999 football season after 32 years as a member of the Penn State football coaching staff, including the last 23 as defensive coordinator.

Sandusky is the founder of The Second Mile, a charitable organization that addresses the welfare of children. The Second Mile was founded in 1977. It's mission is to challenge young people to achieve their potential by providing opportunities for them to develop life skills and self-esteem. The Second Mile offers 10 prevention, early intervention, and community-based programs and services to more than 100,000 children in Pennsylvania each year. The Second Mile is funded through private sector contributions.

"We can't say enough about what he has brought to the football program as an exceptional coach, a fine player and a person of great character and integrity," head coach Joe Paterno said. "The success that the Nittany Lions have enjoyed over the last three decades is due in large part to the contribution of people on

our coaching staff like Jerry Sandusky. Jerry always has dreamed big dreams and, as he's proven with The

Second Mile, he's someone who can turn hope into reality."

"Jerry Sandusky has been an integral part of Penn State since his days as an undergraduate," athletic director Tim Curley said. "He is someone who has set a tone in his professional and personal life that is an inspiration to everyone inside and outside the program. His success as a coach is authenticated by the numerous All-American players he has developed over three decades. His achievement as a human being is splendidly demonstrated by the thousands of youngsters he touches annually through The Second Mile.

Sandusky is largely responsible for Penn State earning the moniker, "Linebacker U," with 10 of his linebackers earning first-team All-American honors: Jack Ham (1970), Charlie Zapiec (1971), John Skorupan (1972), Ed O'Neil (1973), Greg Buttle (1975), Kurt Allerman (1976), Shane Conlan (1985-86), Andre Collins (1989), LaVar Arrington

(1998-99) and Brandon Short (1999).

A three-year Penn State letterman, he was a starting defensive end in 1963-65. Sandusky earned bachelor's and master's degrees in health and physical education in 1966 and 1970, respectively. He graduated first in his class and served as student Marshall for his college at commencement.

Sandusky recently was named an Alumni Fellow in the College of Health and Human Development in recognition of his career achievements. Since the program began in 1973, there have been approximately 300 such awards made University-wide. It is considered the highest honor bestowed by the Alumni Association.

A standout athlete at Washington (Pa.) High School, Sandusky was named Penn State's defensive coordinator in 1977.

In January, 2000, Sandusky was presented a Career Achievement Award by the Philadelphia Sports Writers Association at their annual awards dinner. In 1999, Sandusky was inducted into the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame, Washington-Greene Chapter.

In 1996, Sandusky was selected the Pennsylvania recipient of the SGMA Heroes Award, presented for "contributions to the pursuit of sports excellence, sportsmanship, participation or opportunity within their local community." He was awarded the University's Barash Human Service Award and the YMCA Service-To-Youth Award in 1995 and the Contribution to Amateur Football Award by the Philadelphia Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame in 1994.

In 1993, Sandusky and his late father, Art, received the annual Human Rights Award presented by the Washington, Pa., branch of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.


