

History -

The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame was founded in 1947 and is dedicated to mobilizing the constructive forces of amateur football, at all levels, for the benefit of society.

As stated most clearly by former President and Foundation "Gold Medal" recipient Dwight D. Eisenhower, "In football, in business, in the trades and professions, the normal urge to excel provides one of the most hopeful assurances that our kind of society will continue to advance and prosper. Morale... the will, this heart...we need not only in athletic teams and individuals, but collectively."

To preserve and encourage these values in our nation's youth, the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame helps to bring together all of the organized groups that play, coach, administer, support and report amateur football. It seeks to establish the true concept of the game as an amateur sport, and to gain recognition of the important role it plays in the preservation and advancement of our way of life.

The Central Pennsylvania Chapter is one of many chapters who combine with the national office to honor over 3,000 high school and college scholar athletes each year with nearly \$1,000,000 in scholarships for undergraduate and graduate education. Now in its ninth year, the Central Pennsylvania Chapter is proud to honor 35 high school and 3 college scholar athletes for the 2005-2006 year. Our congratulations to each award recipient who was nominated by their schools.

Procedure for Selecting Award and Scholarship Winners -

At the beginning of the scholastic football season, the president of the Central Pennsylvania Chapter sent a letter and nomination form to each of the 36 high school head football coaches in the centre region. Each school was asked to nominate one senior member from their football team to receive an award from the Central Pennsylvania Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. Each nomination form included a high school transcript, and official test scores (SAT/ACT).

The nomination forms, transcripts and test scores were forwarded to the scholarship selection committee. This committee is composed of knowledgeable representatives from our local chapter who were responsible for evaluating each of the nominees using the following three criteria established by the National office:

40% Academic Achievement

40% Athletic Achievement

20% Extracurricular/Community Service Participation

The scholarship committee carefully evaluated each nominee and rank ordered them accordingly. The rank order was given to the Advisory Board and the top 10 individuals will also receive \$1000 post graduate scholarships.





All-American, All-Pro, Author Enshrined in Hall of Fame

Offensive linemen rarely get the recognition they deserve. They are the "grunts" of football, the men who rarely get credit for anything but almost always get the blame. They are almost anonymous on the playing field unless there is a penalty. Then, their names reverberate throughout the stadium as the public address announcer tells everyone of the mistake they just made.

With that typical experience as part of one's football life, it is a wonder anyone ever plays in the offensive line. But the great ones not only want to play, they love to play. One such man is Keith Dorney, who in 2005 became the first pure offensive lineman for Penn State to be elected to the National Football Foundation College Football Hall of Fame.

"It's a tremendous honor," Dorney said. "When you see the names of the people who are in the Hall of Fame and the Penn State players who are included you realize what an honor it is to be among all those great athletes."

Dorney became the 20th Penn State player or coach to be inducted into the Hall of Fame, but he is the first offensive tackle, guard or center. All the other linemen, except for end Ted Kwalick, were either two-way players of earlier eras or defensive specialists.

Dorney was one of Penn State's best offensive linemen—as well as a living testament to Coach Joe Paterno's philosophy that smart kids can be great athletes. He grew up in Macungie, which is near Allentown, and his great-great grandfather once was part of the Dorney Park ownership.

Dorney began as a tight end at Penn State and made his first start in the 1975 Sugar Bowl against Alabama. In 1976, he became the starting center and when he moved to tackle the next year, he became a first team All-American. In his senior year, Dorney's All-American selection was nearly unanimous when picked by the AP, UPI, Football Writers, NEA and Walter Camp. Just as significantly, Dorney was named a First Team Academic All-American.

In addition, Dorney finished 10th in the balloting for the Lombardi Trophy won by teammate and defensive tackle Bruce Clark as the nation's outstanding lineman/linebacker. As one sportswriter raved, Dorney was the type of offensive lineman who "just knocked everyone down."

Dorney was one of the reasons the Nittany Lions of 1977 and 1978 reeled off consecutive 11-1 campaigns. The 1977 squad won its last eight games, capped by a victory over Arizona State in the Fiesta Bowl to earn the No. 5 final AP ranking. In 1978, Penn State took an 11-0 regular season mark, a 19-game overall winning streak and the No. 1 ranking into the Sugar Bowl but lost to Alabama, 14-7. That game remains the most disappointing one of his entire playing career.

The Detroit Lions made Dorney their number one draft choice and he had an All-Pro career until retiring in 1988. He chronicled that professional experience in a book published by Triumph Books in 2004 entitled: "Black and Honolulu Blue: In the Trenches of the NFL." What's even more noteworthy is that he wrote the book himself, without the assistance of a ghostwriter that most athletes employ for their autobiographies.

Writing is Dorney passion and he is now working on a football novel as well as another non-fiction book. But that is his avocation. For the last three years he has been teaching English to freshmen and seniors at Cardinal Newman High School in nearby Santa Rosa, CA, as well as coaching the football team's offensive line.

Although he earned a business degree at Penn State, he left the business world in 2000 and began teaching special education at several schools in the Northern California's Sonoma wine country while earning his Masters Degree in Education from the University of San Francisco. He lives on several acres in rural Sebastapool, CA, with his wife, Katherine and their two children, Clay, 18, and Alea, 14.

"I really didn't know what I wanted to do when I left the Detroit Lions," Dorney said. "Pro football was a wonderful experience, but one negative was that it took me that much longer to find out what I wanted to be when I grew up. I tried real estate and a few other business ventures, but it just didn't feel right. I finally found my calling in teaching and writing."





Gerry has been recognized for academic honors for the Middle Atlantic Conference in each of his four seasons. Gerry has been an active undergraduate member in the Pennsylvania Institute of Certified Public Accounts and recently admitted to the University Of Pittsburgh School Of Law. Steve not only was a smart football player, but was very intelligent in the classroom at Lock Haven. He received the Carolyn Perry Academic Achievement Award and the Robert O. Booth Scholarship his sophomore, junior and senior years. As a sophomore and junior, he was also awarded the Lock Haven University Health and Physical Education Student of the Year. Steven was chosen as a PSAC Scholar Athlete for all four years. He finished his career with being honored as an All-PSAC Guard and on the ESPN the Magazine Academic All-District Team. Steve will graduate in May with a Health and Physical Education degree, carrying an overall 3.897 G.P.A. Besides having a great career in the classroom and on the field, he found time to be involved in the community with such programs as Lock Haven University Relay for Life and the Lock Haven University Children's Festival. Lance Antolick, Penn State University

Lance Antolick is another chapter in the long line of walk-ons who have found success as members of the Nittany Lion football program. Late in his Penn State career Lance earned a scholarship. Antolick's hard work resulted in little playing time prior to this year, but he persevered and started the first nine games of the 2005 season at center and played in all 12. He was rewarded for his efforts by earning the Richard Maginnis Memorial Award, presented to the team's top senior offensive lineman. He was instrumental in helping Penn State lead the Big Ten in scoring offense (35.2 ppg) in conference games and rank second in the league in all games (34.4 pgg). Antolick helped the Nittany Lions double their scoring average from the 2004 season (17.7 ppg) and allow only 14 sacks to rank third in the Big Ten. He was a key reason why the Lions ranked second in the Big Ten in rushing offense (233.1 ypg) in conference games and overall (212.8 ypg), an increase of 138 yards per game from 2004 (94.6 ypg) in Big Ten contests. Antolick helped Penn State increase its total offense in Big Ten games from 252.8 ypg in 2004 to 425.1 ypg this season (+ 172.3 ypg). The former Jersey Shore Area HS standout was a big factor in Penn State gaining 420 yards or more in six Big Ten games, with three contests over 500 yards. The top offensive game for the Lions was a dominating performance against Minnesota that resulted in a season-high 539 yards of total offense. Penn State rushed for 364 yards, its highest total since gaining 390 yards vs. Michigan State in 2002, and had a pair of 100-yard rushers in Tony Hunt and Michael Robinson. Penn State accumulated 35 first downs against the Golden Gophers, the second-highest total under Joe Paterno. Antolick earned his degree in Aerospace Engineering in December, 2005 with 2.99 cum GPA.
