

Bobby Engram - Penn State All-American

Featured Speaker

Bobby Engram is considered the greatest clutch pass receiver of the Joe Paterno era, if not the best in the 124-year history of Penn State football.

When he graduated in 1996, Engram held 12 team receiving records, and he is still the owner of the records for receiving yards in a career (3,026) and a single season (1,084 in 1995) and most touchdowns in one game (four against Minnesota in 1993) and in a season (13 in 1993). Engram also is tied with O.J. McDuffie for most receptions in a season, with 63 in 1995, while his former record of 167 career receptions was broken by Deon Butler with 171 in the 2009 season.

However, statistics only tell part of what Engram meant to Penn State. He was not only a three-time All-Big Ten and 1994 First Team All-American, but as a junior in 1994 he also was the recipient of the first Biletnikoff Award given annually to the best receiver in college football. That was the season he was a crucial part of one of the greatest offensive teams in college football history, the undefeated Big Ten and Rose Bowl champions that finished No. 2 in the country. Those Nittany Lions set two NCAA records for total offense with 520.2 yards per game and scoring offense with 47.8 points a game.


But it was the receptions that Engram caught under pressure in late fourth quarter game-breaking situations



that made him so valuable to the Lions. Perhaps his best known all-time clutch reception was against Michigan in 1994, when with less than 3 minutes remaining in 24-24 tie he caught a 16-yard pass from quarterback Kerry Collins for the winning TD in game that propelled State to #1 in the polls.

Despite his heroics in 1994, he may have been more valuable and crucial to Penn State's offense in his senior season. Without his fellow All-Americans Collins, tailback Ki-Jana Carter and tight end Kyle Brady in1995, Engram prevented many defeats with his fourthquarter catches for touchdowns, often beating double and triple coverage. It happened in back-to-back games at Purdue and Iowa, and again in the final game of the regular season at Michigan State, when a national TV audience watched as Engram took a pass in a crowd from quarterback Wally Richardson on the 5-yard line with 8 seconds left and no time outs and squirmed past two defenders for the winning TD, 24-20. And to put a crown on his Penn State career, in his final game as a Nittany Lion, Engram was selected as the Most Valuable Player of the 1996 Outback Bowl as he led the Lions to a 43-14 victory over Auburn with four receptions for two touchdowns and 113 yards, and a No. 13 finish in the final national rankings.

When Engram was drafted No. 2 in 1996 by the Chicago Bears, even he would not have believed he would spend the next 15 years playing in the National Football League. That NFL longevity is matched or surpassed by only a handful of other Penn State players in NFL history. It is even more remarkable when one realizes Engram was just 5-foot-10 and 188 pounds. In that span, Engram played for the Bears, Seattle Seahawks, Kansas City Chiefs and Cleveland Browns, and started for the Seahawks in Super Bowl XL in 2005



This spring Engram began a new career in coaching as an assistant offensive coach with the San Francisco 49ers. He also will continue devoting time to the Bobby Engram Foundation that he created several years ago after his daughter, Bobbi, developed sickle cell anemia. The foundation strives to make more people aware of the disease and to help and support families that also are suffering with the disease.

A native of Camden, SC, Engram now makes his permanent home in the Pittsburgh area, along with his wife Deanna, also a Penn State grad, and his three children, Bobbi (13) and sons Dean (11) and Trey (6).

Tribute to: Fran Fisher - The Voice of the Nittany Lions

With the exception of Coach Joe Paterno and a couple of his outstanding players, no one is more synonymous with Penn State football among the Nittany Lion faithful than sportscaster Fran Fisher. Twelve years have passed since he did his last broadcast of a football game at the 1999 Alamo Bowl and retired for the second time, but his popularity continues with the blue and white masses.

Wherever he goes, there always seems to be Penn State fans who want to say hello, shake his hand, and recall some pleasant encounter or remembrance from the past. Maybe it will be about a mutual experience they shared when he visited their town to speak at a local Penn State event or broadcast a football or basketball game. Perhaps it will be about something that happened when he co-hosted the old "TV Quarterbacks" show that aired weekly around the state for 20 years until 1986. Sometimes it's more personal, a man or woman Fisher hardly knows or remembers thanking him for some little favor he did for them over the course of his four decades of broadcasting Penn State football.

It's not simply his longevity behind the microphone that has made Fisher such a recognizable and approachable figure. His friendliness, warm personality, and sense of humor are contagious and he makes everyone he meets feel like a friend, even in his conversations with strangers.

" I like to tell people I was Penn State's play-by-play broadcaster for so long that I was there in 1906 when "Mother" Dunn became our first All-American," Fisher tells people with a wry smile.

Actually, it was 1966, when Fisher was the manager and sportscaster for radio station WKVA in Lewistown, that he joined the Penn State radio network as an analyst. He had moved to Lewistown in 1960, after breaking into the sportscasting profession in 1953 as a part-timer at WHJB in his adopted hometown of Greensburg.

Five years later, Fisher was working full-time for WPSX-TV, and shortly thereafter became the radio network's play-by-play broadcaster. Fisher was soon doing the commentary or play-by-play on radio or TV for other sports, from wrestling and soccer to men's and women's basketball and gymnastics to various high school events. In 1976, Fisher moved to the athletic department in the newly-created position as Radio-Television-Film Coordinator while continuing much of his work for WPSX –TV.

Fisher was promoted to Assistant Athletic Director in early 1982, and his new duties included overseeing the Nittany Lion club and other fund raising efforts as well as public relations and public affairs. That led him to leave the football broadcast booth after seeing Penn State win its first national



championship, but he kept active in a sundry of other areas. In 1987, the radio network created a weekly call-in show for Joe Paterno with Fisher as the host. He continued in that role even after his official retirement from the athletic department at the end of 1988.

Then, in August of 1994, Fisher was asked to return to the Penn State radio broadcasts as the play-by-play man. He teamed with Paterno's brother, George, in a combination was an instant hit with the fans. Fisher retired a second time at the end of 1999, and continues to operate a marketing and adverting sales company with his sons, Jeff and Jerry.

"There's a lot of fun involved in broadcasting because you don't make any money," Fisher has often said. "If you don't have any fun, you might as well get out of the business."

Fran Fisher had a lot of fun for many, many years. And thanks to him, hundreds of thousands of Penn State fans did. too.


Kellie is the Executive Director of the Bedford County Chamber of Commerce. In addition to her work to promote the business community of Bedford County and the sur-



To preserve and encourage these values in our nation's youth, the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame helps to bring together all of the organ-

ized groups that play, coach, administer, support and report amateur football. It seeks to establish the true concept of the game as an amateur sport, and to gain recognition of the important role it plays in the preservation and advancement of our way of life.

The Central Pennsylvania Chapter is one of many chapters who combine with the national office to honor over 3,000 high school and college scholar athletes each year with nearly \$1,000,000 in scholarships for undergraduate and graduate education. Now in its 14th year, the Central Pennsylvania Chapter is proud to honor 44 high school and 10 college scholar athletes for the 2010-2011 year. Our congratulations to each award recipient who was nominated by their schools.







Procedure for Selecting Award and Scholarship Winners -

At the beginning of the scholastic football season, the president of the Central Pennsylvania Chapter sent a letter and nomination form to each of the 45 high school head football coaches in the centre region. Each school was asked to nominate one senior member from their football team to receive an award from the Central Pennsylvania Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. Each nomination form included a high school transcript and official test scores (SAT/ACT).

The nomination forms, transcripts and test scores were forwarded to the scholarship selection committee. This committee is composed of knowledgeable representatives from our local chapter who were responsible for evaluating each of the nominees using the following three criteria established by the National office:

Academic Achievement 40%

Athletic Achievement 40%

Extracurricular/Community Service Participation 20%

The scholarship committee carefully evaluated each nominee and rank ordered them accordingly. The rank order was given to the Advisory Board and the top 10 individuals will also receive \$1000 post graduate scholarships.

Community Service Award in Honor of Joe Sarra: Coach, Friend, Advisor

Joe Sarra was a football coach for 40 years, but he has been more than just a coach to most of the players, fellow coaches and football fans he met in his career. Joe was a friend and advisor to many of his players, an honest, hard worker to his coaching colleagues, and a caring and compassionate man to the thousands of other people met over the decades. Football and family has been his passion but helping others was his avocation.

Joe is typical of the western Pennsylvania young men of his generation. They were the children of hard working blue collar families, sons of the tough and intense men who labored in the hot steel mills or underground in the dusty coal mines. Don't follow us, the fathers told them. Make something of your self, they said. Go to college and get an education, they urged. And sports—particularly football--was the way to do it.

So, Sarra left his home in Belle Vernon, 20 miles southeast of Pittsburgh, in 1956 and entered a small college down the road, then known as California State Teachers College. He went there to play football, and to be a teacher, studying social studies education and guidance. After graduation in 1960, he stayed in the area and was hired by East Washington High School to teach social science with additional duties as the head coach of the football team. That would be the start of his lifetime dream—to coach football and teach young men.

A year later, Joe was back in his hometown as an assistant coach at Belle Vernon High School, and guidance counselor. But that wasn't enough for Sarra. He was also continuing his education, working part-time on a Master's Degree in secondary administration and counseling from the University of West Virginia, just across the state line from the football hotbeds of southwestern Pennsylvania. He did that in 1964, the same year he became an assistant coach at nearby Hempfield High School.

However, Joe wanted to be a head coach again. So, in 1967 he left western Pennsylvania for the hard coal region, becoming the head coach and social studies teacher at Southern Columbia High School. He loved his job but he wanted more. He had always wanted to coach in college, and in 1970 he had his chance, when Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, hired him as an assistant. Sarra never looked back.


The next season, 1971, Lafayette University came calling, and Joe spent the next 12 years there, first as the offensive coordinator until 1975 and then as the defensive coordinator. Now, Joe really fell in love—in love with defensive coaching. Joe knew he could coach defense at a higher level.

Penn State's head coach Joe Paterno and his defensive coordinator Jerry Sandusky thought so too. In 1984, they hired Sarra as the inside linebackers coach. Nine years later, Sarra was promoted to defensive line coach, and he stayed there through the 1999 season, when he moved into the front office as an administrator, retiring in 2005.


Throughout his professional career, Joe was always involved in volunteer work for the communities he lived in. One of his favorite organizations was the Second Mile charity for children. But perhaps his greatest service to the community and



to Penn State was his dedication to the rehabilitation of Adam Taliaferro, the Penn State cornerback who was paralyzed in a game against Ohio State in 2000. Joe was the liaison with the Taliaferro family and spent many of his days with Adam and the family in the year that Adam recovered and was able to walk again.

Bob Weller Lifetime of Service to Pennsylvania Football



Bob Weller is one of the best known and likable high school officials in Pennsylvania.

Weller became a registered PIAA basketball and football official in1960, and ended a sterling 50-year officiating career this past fall. He officiated hundreds of Pennsylvania high school football games, including numerous District 6 and PIAA state playoff games, the East-West Coaches All Star game and the 2001 PIAA State Class A championship contest between Rochester and Southern Columbia

Bob's strength as a football official resulted from a keen understanding of the rules of the game, combined with an innate ability to effectively manage the 22 players on the field, as well as the coaches on the sideline. He was most effective in keeping the highly charged emotions of a football game within the intent and spirit of the rules. Players and coaches alike knew that, when Bob Weller was heading the officiating crew, the game was in good hands.

Weller grew up in Ligonier, PA and was an outstanding football, basketball, baseball player at Ligonier High School. He went on to get his bachelor's degree at Slippery Rock University, and won honors as a 1955 College All-State halfback. He still holds the Slippery Rock record for longest run from scrimmage—98 yards. Bob went on to coach three sports in high school and college, including assistant football coaching positions at Slippery Rock and West Virginia University—where he earned his graduate degree.

Later Weller became the head coach of Lock Haven University and before he retired from Lock Haven he spent several years as the Associate Director of Athletics.


Just before he officiated in his last game at Lock Haven on Nov. 5, 2010 Weller told the Lock Haven Express:"I've met some great coaches and great people in my
