

Brandon Noble Featured Speaker

The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame, Central Pennsylvania Chapter, has selected former Penn State football player Brandon Noble as guest speaker for its 20th annual scholar-athlete awards dinner. The dinner will be held on Sunday, March 12 at The Penn Stater Hotel and Conference Center.


Noble broke onto the scene at Penn State as a sophomore totaling 22 tackles and two sacks while helping Penn State to an undefeated season and a Rose Bowl victory over Oregon in 1994. Noble became a defensive stalwart for the Lions during the 1995 and 1996 seasons, collecting a combined 125 tackles and 12 sacks. He was named the defensive Most Valuable Player of the 1997 Fiesta Bowl.

The San Francisco 49ers signed Noble as an undrafted free agent in 1997 with multiple stints on their practice squad. Noble signed as a free agent with Dallas Cowboys in 1999 and was assigned to the Barcelona Dragons of NFL Europe. He would eventually make his way onto the Cowboys roster that fall as a back-up defensive tackle. In 2001 Noble worked his way into the starting line-up in Dallas where he contributed 56 tackles and 3.5 sacks and was selected by his teammates as winner of the NFL's Unsung Hero Award. He finished Cowboys career in 2002, making 32 consecutive starts. Noble signed with the Washington Redskins in 2003 and retired in 2006.

Since retiring from the NFL Noble has held assistant coaching positions with West Chester University, the UFL's Omaha Firehawks, Coastal Carolina University and most notably as a member of Matt Rhule's coaching staff at Temple University in 2012.

Currently, Noble hosts the D2 Podcast. He is a regular guest on CSN Philadelphia's Breakfast on Broad.



Lifetime Achievement in Football Award Winner: George Curry, Berwick & Wyoming Valley West High Schools



George Curry grew up in the coal-mining Larksville. town of Pennsylvania. He John's attended St. Parochial Elementary School and Larksville High School where he was an honor student. He received a football scholarship to Temple University where he earned his B.S. in Social Sciences. He attended Penn State University and the University of Scranton where he

received his Master's Degree in Administration and Supervision. Over the next 36 years he was a teacher, Assistant Principal and Assistant to the Superintendent in the Berwick Area School District. He also coached football for 38 years at Berwick High School.

As a football coach he had amazing success, becoming the winningest coach in Pennsylvania history with 455 wins, six State Championships and three USA Today National Championships.

Coach Curry was a stern disciplinarian and prepared his players well as he taught and preached commitment, accountability, leadership and work ethic.

Coach Curry was all about education and was responsible for acquiring millions of dollars in scholarships for his players. Over 120 players received full scholarships and hundreds more received partial scholarships. His players were parts of collegiate football teams from across the country. He was very proud of the fact that 78% of his players who attended college received their degree.

Lifetime Contribution to Football Award - Coaching: Dave Baker, Williamsburg & Central High Schools

Coach Dave Baker is a 1963 graduate of Central HS and a 1967 graduate of Indiana University of Pennsylvania. Coach Baker has been coaching High School football for fifty years.

At Williamsburg HS he taught Biology and Science and coached football for thirty five years, thirty one as Head Coach. His Williamsburg teams 1975,76, 77, 1980, 82, 84, 89 and 90 were outstanding teams with excellent records. His 1984 team was undefeated and shared the Mid-Penn Conference Championship. In 1987 Williamsburg HS was a District 6 Class A semifinalist. The 1989 team was Mid-Penn Conference Champion and played in the District 6 Class A Finals. In 1990 Coach Baker won his 100th. game and his team made it to the District 6 Class A final game, once again.

After retiring from Williamsburg School District, Coach Baker was able to stay in coaching while working as an assistant coach at Chestnut Ridge HS for six years. When the opportunity presented itself for him to return to his alma mater,

Central HS, he jumped at the opportunity. After working for three years as an assistant coach at Central he was elevated to the Head Coaching position and currently remains there.

During Coach Baker's six years at Central HS his teams have amassed a record of 58 wins and 18 losses, won District VI Championships in 2013, 2015 and 2016 and were State semi-finalists in 2015 and 2016.



Coach Baker and his wife Nancy live in Roaring Springs, have three grown sons Jay, Matt and Andy and seven grandchildren.

Lifetime Contribution to Football Award - Coaching: Don Bailey, Forest Hills High School



Don Bailey is 1969 graduate Forest Hills HS. He B.S.. received his M.E. and Principals Certification from the California University of Pennsylvania and his Letter of Eligibility for Superintendent from Penn State University.

At Forest Hills High School during his 38-year career he served as Teacher, Asst.

Principal, Principal, Director of Education and Superintendent. He retired from all educational related responsibilities in 2011. He continues to be the Head Football Coach.

In Don's thirty four years as Head Coach at Forest Hills HS his teams have won 355 games and enjoyed nine undefeated regular seasons in

addition to thirteen seasons of ten or more wins. Don Bailey is the fourth active winningest coach in Pennsylvania and the 34th active winningest coach in the United States.

His teams have won 14 conference championships, nine District VI Championships, appeared in District playoffs 25 times, were Region III Champions on five different occasions and were PIAA State Finalists in 1994.

For Don Bailey, Coach of the Year honors were numerous . . . PA Coach of the Year . . . Laurel Highlands Coach of the Year . . . Southern Alleghenies Coach of the Year . . . Tribune-Democrat Coach of the Year. Over his 34 year career he was designated Coach of the Year on 26 different occasions.

Don was chosen to coach in the Big-33 game in 1983 and in the Pennsylvania EAST/WEST GAME in 2002.

In 2010 Don Bailey was inducted into the PA Football Coaches Hall of Fame.

Lifetime Contribution to Football Award - Coaching: Gary Klingensmith, Juniata High School

Coach Gary Klingensmith was born in Brownsville, Pa. in 1943. At Brownsville HS he was a two sport standout athlete in baseball and football. After the 1960 football season he was voted onto the All Monongahela Valley Conference Football Team.

Never permitting his hearing impairment to stifle his march to success, he entered Penn State University in 1961 with a full football athletic scholarship. During the 1963 season Coach Klingensmith led the Nittany Lions in rushing, touchdowns and kickoff returns. This great season led to the American Football Coaches Association placing him on their preseason All-American list prior to the 1964 season.

Upon graduation from Penn State Gary was hired by Gallaudet College for the Hearing Impaired in Washington, D.C. to be their Head Football Coach. At 22 years of age, he was the youngest Head Football Coach in all of collegiate football. He remained at Gallaudet for three football seasons.

He entered the high school coaching ranks in 1969 when he was hired to teach Physical Education and become the Head Football Coach at Juniata High School in Mifflintown, Pa. He retired from his teaching responsibilities in 2007 after 38 years. He remains the football coach until the present time.

Coach Klingensmith's 48 seasons as Head Coach at Juniata HS can proudly claim 291 wins, 3 undefeated seasons, a 28 game winning streak, a 21 game winning streak and one District III Championship. Histeams have also won numerous League championships and twice advanced to the Finals of the District VI Championships.

The Boy Scouts of America honored Coach Klingensmith with the

highly prestigious Good Scout Award in 2003. Gallaudet College followed up in 2004 by awarding Gary with it's Kendall Award given to a deaf person for notable excellence in a professional field not related to deafness. He was inducted into the Pennsylvania Scholastic Football Coaches Hall of Fame in 2012.

Gary and his wife Linda have three children and seven grandchildren.



Lifetime Contribution to Football Award - Football Officiating: Lou Idzojtic



Conway , Pa., a small town in Western Pa. He attended Freedom High School where was a three athlete. sport football, basketball and track. His 1969 high school football team was undefeated and won the WPIAL Class B Championship. That vear he was selected " Offensive Lineman of the Year. " His football playing days at IUP were cut short due to injury. He graduated from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1973 with a Bachelor of

Science Degree in Elementary Education. For 31 years Lou taught sixth grade Science in the Purchase Line School District where he also was assistant varsity coach for two years in football and three years in basketball.

Lou's career in officiating began while still a freshman at IUP. He became part of the intra-mural program as an official for intra-mural athletics. In September of 1970 he took and passed the PIAA required exams for officiating both football and basketball. This led to a 32 year career

Lou Idzojtic was born in in basketball officiating and a 47 year career in football.

As a twenty year member of the Tri-County Chapter of Football/Basketball Officials of Indiana, Pa. Lou has served as President, Board of Control and Rules Interpreter. Lou credits his long time career and success as an official to a number of his friends and mentor . . . Mike Gaydosh, Dwight Brocious, Stanley Bem Dan Sullivan and Ron Rickens.

Lou's 47-year career as a football official include working six District VI finals, two Western PIAA Finals and two PIAA State Finals. He was a member of the officiating crew which refereed the first ever PIAA Final game in Beaver Stadium in 1988 between Pittsburgh Central Catholic and Cedar Cliff. In 1998 his crew worked the Single A State Final game in Hershey Park between Southern Columbia and Rochester.

In 2000 Dr. Robert Lombardi, Executive Director of the PIAA, nominated Lou Idzoitic selected as the "Pennsylvania Football Official of the Year" for the National Federation Official's Association.

Today Lou Idzojtic will be presented with The Lifetime Contribution Award for his many years of exemplary service to the young men who have played the game of football under his watchful eye.

Lifetime Contribution to Football Award - Athletic Training:

James L. Thornton

James L. Thornton, a highly respected, dedicated and experienced athletic trainer, is in his 27th year as head athletic trainer at Clarion University in 2016-17. A 2016 inductee into the Pennsylvania Athletic Trainers Hall of Fame, he received the D-II "Athletic Trainer of the Year" award from the NATA in June 2008 and is committed to the continual advancement of the profession of athletic training.

Certified by the Athletic Training board of Certification, Thornton is a Performance Enhancement Specialist certified by the National Academy of Sports Medicine (NASM) and has served as an education liaison

and consultant to NASM for 13 years.

Thornton has an extensive background of 33 years in athletic training and collegiate sports experience. He has helped develop performance enhancement programs at multiple universities with content being used at both the baccalaureate and masters degree levels.

Thornton was the President of the NATA from 2012 through 2015, a three-year term. Prior to his election as NATA President, he served the NATA as both Vice President and a member of the Board of Directors, serving as the Director of District II.

Thornton continues to serve as the Athletic Training liaison to the NCAAWrestling Rules Committee since 1997. He is the contact person for all NCAA wrestling in regards to weight-class certification procedures and the rules regarding disposition of athletes with skin infections. ng disposition of authors with standard athletic trainer
Thornton was a graduate assistant athletic trainer

at University Of The Pacific beginning in the Fall of 1987. He was awarded his Masters Degree in Sports Medicine at U.O.P. in 1989 and posted an outstanding 3.8 QPA. He was then hired by U.O.P. as Assistant Athletic Trainer in the Fall of 1989 and remained in that position until coming to Clarion in June of 1990.

A native of Mt. Pleasant, Utah, Thornton was a five-sport athlete at North Sanpete High and was graduated in 1977.

He served as a student athletic trainer for four years under Dale

Mildenberger for football, wrestling, women's gymnastics, baseball, women's softball and track. He earned a B.S. Degree in Biology and Exercise Science in 1987 from Utah State.

Currently, Thornton is a member of the Clarion University faculty as well as an adjunct faculty member at California University of PA and Duquesne University. Jim and wife Bridget have daughters Mattison, Maci and Maya.



Fran Fisher Award "Excellence in Sports Journalism": Gary Chrisman



A Williamsport native, Gary is a 1971 graduate of Williamsport High School and a 1975 graduate of the University of Miami. He started his broadcast career in college in 1972, and from 1973 to 1975 he did Miami Hurricane Football and Baseball radio play by play. In his senior year, he was Sports Director of WVUM Radio and was honored with a scholarship award by the Florida Sportscasters Association. He was also honored as a member of the National Broadcast Society, Alpha Epsilon Rho, and in 1975 received their award as one of the top three communications students at the University of Miami.

He started his local broadcast career during his college vacations from 1973 to 1975 at WWPA radio in Williamsport. After college, he returned to his home town and started the popular Chrisman Morning Show with his zany cast of characters on WWPA (The Twin W). In 1987, he moved the show to mornings on Kiss FM (WKSB) and in April he'll celebrate the 30th Anniversary of the Chrisman Show on Kiss FM.

In 1974, Gary teamed up with his longtime partner, Ken Sawyer, and broadcasted his first Little League World Series. This August, he'll call his 44th straight Little League World Series nationwide on the official Little League Baseball Network.

Chrisman also teamed up with Ken Sawyer in 1975-76 doing West Branch Conference Football and Basketball, and in 1978 they became the exclusive radio voices of Williamsport Millionaire Sports. From 1984 to 1987, Gary was featured on the syndicated television series, PM Magazine as a reporter and co-host on WNEP-TV. In 1987, he moved his sports broadcast career to TV by pioneering televised high school and college sports and started Cable Sports Productions. This fall marked Chrisman's 30th season televising the local football and basketball game of the week. In total, he has broadcasted sports in the area for 44 years.

Since 2011, Gary has been the lead announcer for WVIA's televised production of the Little League Challenger Exhibition Game played at Volunteer Stadium the final weekend of the Little League World Series. The annual telecast has been seen across the nation on participating PBS affiliates. The 2011 broadcast was awarded an Emmy for Outstanding Special Program in the Middle Atlantic Region. This August, Chrisman will again serve as on air anchor and host of the Little League World Series Grand Slam Parade to be broadcast live on WBRE-TV. This will be his 9th year as TV host for the event.

In 2014, Gary was inducted in the West Branch Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame. In the summer of 2016, Chrisman became one of the first 20 sports personalities in Lycoming County to be honored with the permanent placement of a medallion in the City of Williamsport Sports Walk.

The Fran Fisher Award will be presented annually to an individual who exemplifies the character and professionalism of Fran Fisher as they promote the values and goals of amateur football while applying their craft.

Community Service Award in Honor of Joe Sarra: Coach, Friend, Advisor

Joe Sarra was a football coach for 40 years, but he has been more than just a coach to most of the players, fellow coaches and football fans he met in his career. Joe was a friend and advisor to many of his players, an honest, hard worker to his coaching colleagues, and a caring and compassionate man to the thousands of other people met over the decades. Football and family has been his passion but helping others was his avocation.

Joe is typical of the Western Pennsylvania young men of his generation. They were the children of hard working blue collar families, sons of the tough and intense men who labored in the hot steel mills or underground in the dusty coal mines. Don't follow us, the fathers told them. Make something of yourself, they said. Go to college and get an education, they urged. And sports—particularly football -- was the way to do it.

Sarra left his home in Belle Vernon, 20 miles southeast of Pittsburgh, in 1956 and entered a small college down the road, then known as California State Teachers College. He went there to play football, and to be a teacher, studying social studies education and guidance. After graduation in 1960, he stayed in the area and was hired by East Washington High School to teach social science with additional duties as the head coach of the football team. That would be the start of his lifetime dream—to coach football and teach young men.

A year later, Joe was back in his hometown as an assistant coach at Belle Vernon High School, and guidance counselor. But that wasn't enough for Sarra. He was also continuing his education, working part-time on a Master's Degree in secondary administration and counseling from the University of West Virginia, just across the state line from the football hotbeds of southwestern Pennsylvania. He did that in 1964, the same year he became an assistant coach at nearby Hempfield High School.

However, Joe wanted to be a head coach again. So, in 1967 he left western Pennsylvania for the hard coal region, becoming the head coach and social studies teacher at Southern Columbia High School. He loved his job but he wanted more. He had always wanted to coach in college, and in 1970 he had his chance, when Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, hired him as an assistant. Sarra never looked

The next season, 1971, Lafayette University came calling, and Joe spent the next 12 years there, first as the offensive coordinator until 1975 and then as the defensive coordinator. Now, Joe really felt the passion of coaching defense. Joe knew he could coach defense at a higher level.

In 1984, Penn State hired Sarra as the inside linebackers coach. Nine years later, Sarra was promoted to defensive line coach, and he stayed there through the 1999 season, when he moved into the front office as an administrator, retiring in 2005.

Throughout his professional career, Joe was always involved in volunteer work for the communities he lived in. Perhaps his greatest service to the community and to Penn State was his dedication to the rehabilitation of Adam Taliaferro, the Penn State cornerback who was paralyzed in a game against Ohio State in 2000. Joe was the liaison with the Taliaferro family and spent many of his days with Adam and the family in the year that Adam recovered and was able to walk again.
