



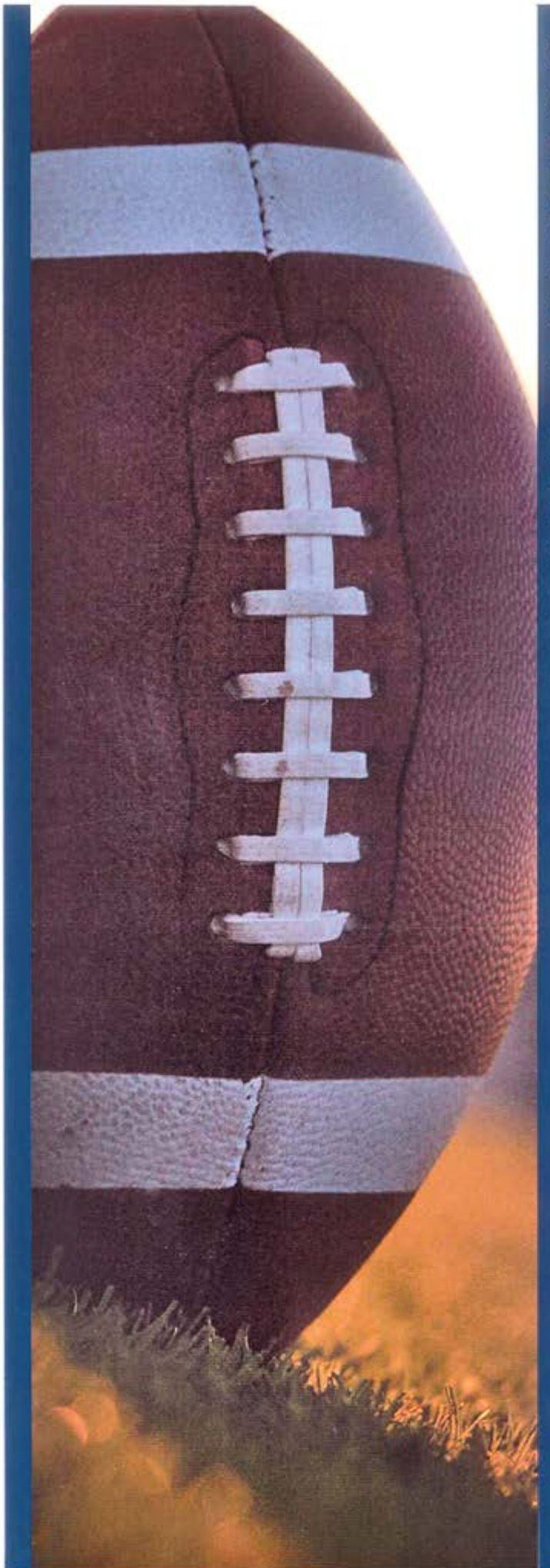

# Trace McSorley

## Featured Speaker

The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF), Central Pennsylvania Chapter, has selected former Penn State, Big Ten Championship Game MVP and NFL free-agent quarterback Trace McSorley as guest speaker for its 27th scholar-athlete awards dinner. The dinner will be held on Sunday, March 17 at The Penn Stater Hotel and Conference Center.

The NFF holds players in high esteem who can achieve success on the field, in the classroom, and as members of the community making McSorley an outstanding choice to serve as this year's guest speaker. During his senior season at Penn State in 2018 McSorley became the 18th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete. He was also a Google Cloud/COSIDA Academic All-District selection and Academic All-Big Ten. McSorley graduated in 2018 with a degree in accounting and is pursuing a second degree in journalism.

As the Nittany Lions starting quarterback from 2016-19, McSorley posted a 31-9 record to help lead the program back to national prominence. In his first season as a starter in 2016 Penn State finished 11-3 winning the Big Ten Championship with McSorley being named the game's MVP and earning the Nittany Lions a trip to the Rose Bowl. He finished 2016 by throwing for 3,614 yds with 29 TD and added another seven on the ground en route to All-Big Ten Second Team Honors. McSorley and Penn State were even better in 2017, going 11-2 with a 35-28 victory over Washington in the Fiesta Bowl. McSorley was named the game's MVP with 342 yds. passing and two TD. Earning Second Team All-Big Ten honors again in 2017, McSorley threw for 3,570 yds, 28 TD and had a 162.4 rating. With McSorley at the helm for his final season in 2018 Penn State posted a 9-4 mark, earning a berth in the Citrus Bowl.

In 2019 McSorley was a 6th round draft pick of the Baltimore Ravens in the NFL draft. Following two and a half seasons with the Ravens, McSorley has played for the Arizona Cardinals, New England Patriots, Chicago Bears and Pittsburgh Steelers.

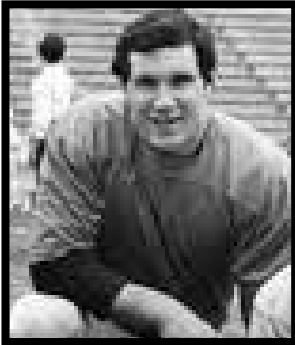

# Community Service Award in Honor of Joe Sarra: Coach, Friend, Advisor

Joe Sarra was a football coach for 40 years, but he has been more than just a coach to most of the players, fellow coaches and football fans he met in his career. Joe was a friend and advisor to many of his players, an honest, hard worker to his coaching colleagues, and a caring and compassionate man to the thousands of other people met over the decades. Football and family has been his passion but helping others was his avocation.

Joe is typical of the Western Pennsylvania young men of his generation. They were the children of hard working blue collar families, sons of the tough and intense men who labored in the hot steel mills or underground in the dusty coal mines. Don't follow us, the fathers told them. Make something of yourself, they said. Go to college and get an education, they urged. And sports—particularly football -- was the way to do it.

Sarra left his home in Belle Vernon, 20 miles southeast of Pittsburgh, in 1956 and entered a small college down the road, then known as California State Teachers College. He went there to play football, and to be a teacher, studying social studies education and guidance. After graduation in 1960, he stayed in the area and was hired by East Washington High School to teach social science with additional duties as the head coach of the football team. That would be the start of his lifetime dream—to coach football and teach young men.

A year later, Joe was back in his hometown as an assistant coach at Belle Vernon High School, and guidance counselor. But that wasn't enough for Sarra. He was also continuing his education, working part-time on a Master's Degree in secondary administration and counseling from the University of West Virginia,

just across the state line from the football hotbeds of southwestern Pennsylvania. He did that in 1964, the same year he became an assistant coach at nearby Hempfield High School.

However, Joe wanted to be a head coach again. So, in 1967 he left western Pennsylvania for the hard coal region, becoming the head coach and social studies teacher at Southern Columbia High School. He loved his job but he wanted more. He had always wanted to coach in college, and in 1970 he had his chance, when Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, hired him as an assistant. Sarra never looked back.

The next season, 1971, Lafayette University came calling, and Joe spent the next 12 years there, first as the offensive coordinator until 1975 and then as the defensive coordinator. Now, Joe really felt the passion of coaching defense. Joe knew he could coach defense at a higher level.

In 1984, Penn State hired Sarra as the inside linebackers coach. Nine years later, Sarra was promoted to defensive line coach, and he stayed there through the 1999 season, when he moved into the front office as an administrator, retiring in 2005.

Throughout his professional career, Joe was always involved in volunteer work for the communities he lived in. Perhaps his greatest service to the community and to Penn State was his dedication to the rehabilitation of Adam Taliaferro, the Penn State cornerback who was paralyzed in a game against Ohio State in 2000. Joe was the liaison with the Taliaferro family and spent many of his days with Adam and the family in the year that Adam recovered and was able to walk again.

# Lifetime Achievement Award: College Coaches



**Steve Briggs**  
**Susquehanna**  
**University Football**

Coach Briggs started his football coaching career in 1982 at his alma mater, Springfield College. He then coached at Bowdoin College, University of Richmond, Lehigh University and Susquehanna University. He was named Head Coach at Susquehanna in the spring of 1990 and at the time was the youngest head coach in all divisions at 27 years old. He remained Susquehanna's Head Football Coach for 25 years. He coached on SU's sidelines longer than any other coach, coaching 253 games.

He guided Susquehanna to three NCAA Tournament appearances, including a spot in the national semi-finals in 1991, losing only to the eventual national champions. Coach Briggs is the winningest head football coach in SU program history with 127 wins with three conference championships. His commitment to Susquehanna far transcended the field with the hundreds of lives that he touched.

Coach Briggs coached an impressive list of 73 first team all-conference players, five being named conference players of the year. He also mentored seven All-Americans and four Academic All-Americans. Coach Briggs served on various NCAA committees through the years including serving as the East Region NCAA Division III Football Championship Committee Chairman.

Steve Briggs was inducted into the Susquehanna University Hall of Fame in 2016 and the Susquehanna University Football Ring of Honor in 2019. He was a Liberty Mutual National Coach of the Year Finalist, MAC Commonwealth League Coach of the Year,

AFCA Regional Coach of the Year, Liberty League Coaching Staff of the Year and received a 25-year recognition as a member of the American Football Coaches Association.

Coach Briggs retired from coaching in 2014 but remained at Susquehanna in the role of Senior Advancement Officer for Athletics, raising funds for the Athletic Department. He recently retired in January 2024 after serving for over 35 years at Susquehanna University. Steve has been married to his wife Christina for 35 years and they have two children, son Cory and daughter Casey.



**Steve Wiser**  
**Lycoming College**

For the past 54 years, defense for the Lycoming College football team has had one constant - "The Wizard."

Steve Wiser, who entered his 50th year as an assistant coach for the Warriors in 2023, is more than a legend at Lycoming College. He was the architect of a defensive corps that changed the fortunes of the football program in the '70s before presiding over a damaging defense that has won 15 MAC titles in the last 43 years.

Coach Wiser, currently serves as the associate head coach and co-defensive coordinator. He began his tenure as an assistant coach working with linebackers before being promoted to defensive coordinator in 1977.

Wiser has led the Warriors to the No. 1 national ranking in total defense twice during his tenure (1975, 1983). His teams have also posted nationally-leading numbers in rushing defense (1976, '82 and '87) and scoring defense ('99).

During his time at Lycoming, the Warriors have posted a record of 343-164-5, while garnering 12 NCAA playoff appearances, including two trips to the national title game. His defense topped the MAC 18 times and has posted a total of 68 shutouts.

The Warriors led the MAC in scoring defense for the third straight year in 2013, surrendering only (18 points per game), also topping the league in total defense (304.0 yards per game), rushing defense (91.4 per game). His defense led the MAC in scoring defense in 2012, surrendering only (12.4 points per game). Additional outstanding statistics achieved during Coach Wiser's tenure as the defensive coordinator, as well as the awards won by his defensive players are far too numerous to mention. Along with the tremendous mentorship he provided both to his players and his staff.

In addition to his coaching duties, Coach Wiser organizes the football program's annual golf outing and ad sales for the gameday programs, along with serving the community in several service and charity events, including his work every year with Favors Forward's Spring Cleanup.

A 1974 Lycoming graduate, Coach Wiser excelled in wrestling and football, earning elections into the Lycoming College Athletics, Bald Eagle Area High School, West Branch Valley and Centre County Halls of Fame. He also was honored with the 2018 Ray Keyes Award at the Lycoming County Brotherhood Citation Dinner. He earned four letters while playing for the Warriors as a hard-nosed linebacker, twice earning All-MAC honors. He was also an outstanding wrestler at Lycoming, qualifying for the NCAA Small College Championships as a senior.

Coach Wiser earned a bachelor's degree in political science, before attending graduate classes in education at Marywood College, Wilkes College and Mansfield University. Coach Wiser taught social studies at Williamsport Area High School from 1974 until his retirement in 2006. He resides in Williamsport with his wife, Pam.

**Krajewski**

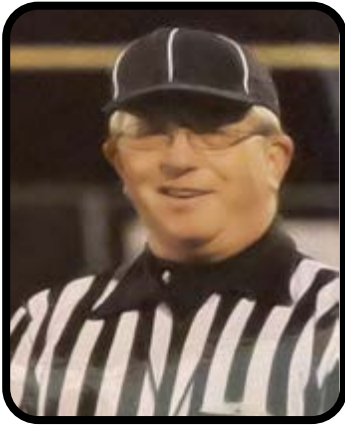

## Procedure for Selecting Award and Scholarship Winners

At the close of the scholastic football season, the president of the Central Pennsylvania Chapter sent a letter and nomination form to each of the 96 high school head football coaches in the PA center region. Each school was asked to nominate one senior member from their football team qualify to receive an award from the Central Pennsylvania Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. Each nomination form included a high school transcript and official test scores (SAT/ACT). The nomination forms, transcripts and test scores were forwarded to the scholarship selection committee. This committee is composed of knowledgeable representatives from our local chapter who were responsible for evaluating each of the nominees using the following three criteria established by the National office:

- **Academic Achievement - 40%**
- **Athletic Achievement - 40%**
- **Extracurricular/Community Service Participation - 20%**

The scholarship committee carefully evaluated each nominee and rank ordered them accordingly. The rank order was used to award \$1,000 postgraduate scholarships.

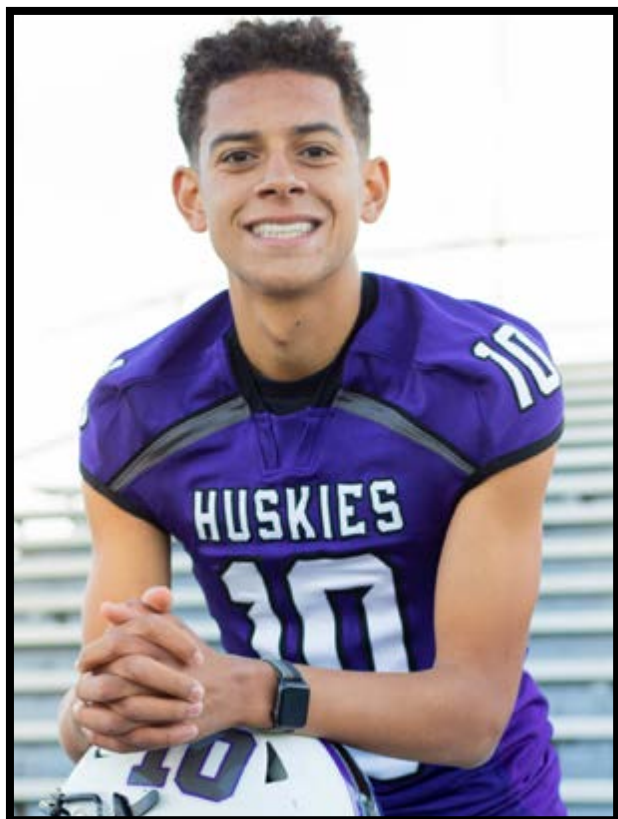

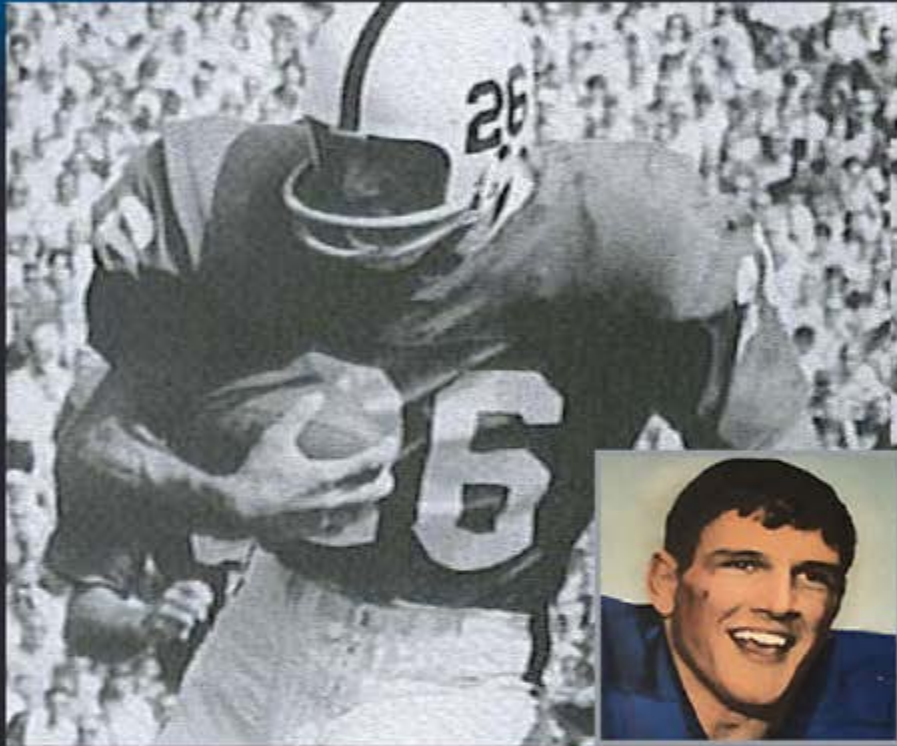

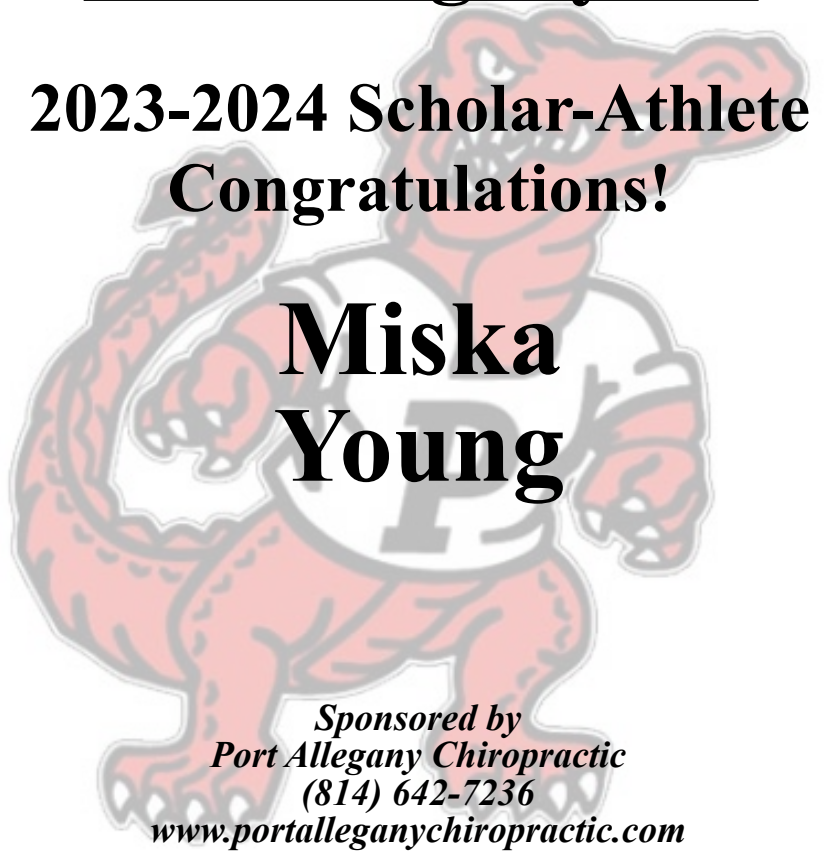
