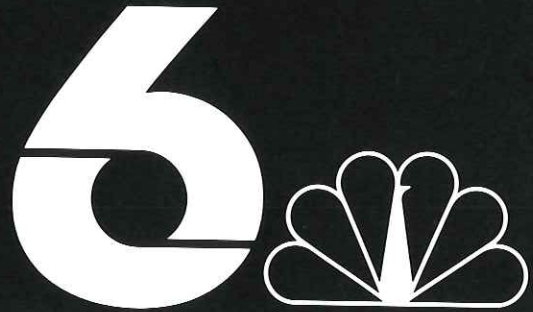

# The Mid-State Football Classic

The Mid-State Football Classic is unique among regional All-Star Games in that it is run by the local football coaches association under the sponsorship of area businesses.

When the Pennsylvania Big 33 game became an inter-state game with Maryland in 1985, the number of Pennsylvania athletes able to participate in an all-star game was limited. The Central Pennsylvania Football Coaches Association established this regional game to provide an opportunity for more high school seniors to take part in this final game of their scholastic career.

Supported by area businesses who supplied early financial support, the first game was held last June in Mansion Park in Altoona. Following the first game six

\$500 scholarships were awarded, and it is the goal of this year's officials to increase the scholarship fund to make ten \$500 awards after this year's game.

The goals of this All-Star Game are the recognition of excellence in regional football performance, promotion of football in general and high school football specifically, and funding for a program of scholarships and ongoing education in football.

The patrons, program advertisers and player sponsors are essential to our program; without them we could not continue our program. The degree to which we are able to achieve our goals will depend upon the continuation of support by football and sports fans.

## Player Selections

Players are selected for this game by the members of the Central Pennsylvania Football Coaches Association through a multi-step process. This selection proceeds as follows:

1. Players are nominated by written nomination in December and January. Each school may nominate no more than five players.
2. Players nominated are polled to ascertain that they will play if selected.
3. Each school's coach is asked to make one "automatic selection." This player will definitely be named for the game.
4. Members of the association select coaching staffs from among schools in each division—North and South.
5. After film review and with advice from coaches within each division, the balance of players are selected by each staff.

Division of schools is on a geographic and attendance basis. The total enrollments within the division are within 20 students of each other.

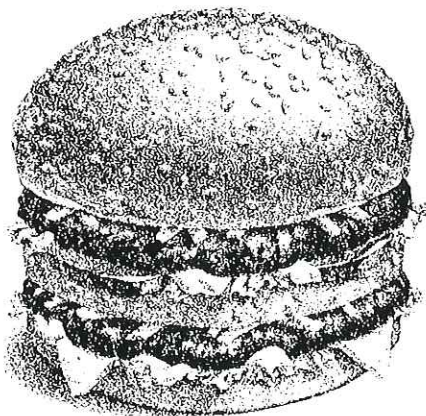

# Mid-State Classic # 1-1985

The South beat the North in the first Mid-State Football Classic last June, 14-13, when Altoona tackle George Zlupko blocked an extra-point attempt after the North scored its second touchdown early in the fourth period.

The game attracted 2,800 fans at Altoona's Mansion Park even though it rained before the game and during the first half.

Zlupko was named the top defensive player for the South. Other award winners in the game were Bill Andrus of Bellefonte (top defensive player for the North), Keith Powell of Philipsburg-Osceola (the North's top offensive player) and Joey Irwin of Bishop Guilfoyle (the South's Offensive MVP).

The South scored first when Cubby Davis of Hollidaysburg hit Steve Miller of Bellwood-Antis on a 54-yard pass.

Andrus set up the North's first TD when he returned an interception 61 yards to the nine late in the second quarter.

The TD came on a nine-yard pass from Kevin Carpin of P-O to State's Phil Willenbrock.

Jim Woodring of Bellwood-Antis and the South scored with 4:50 left in the third period on a one-yard plunge, giving Coach John Hayes' squad a 14-7 lead.

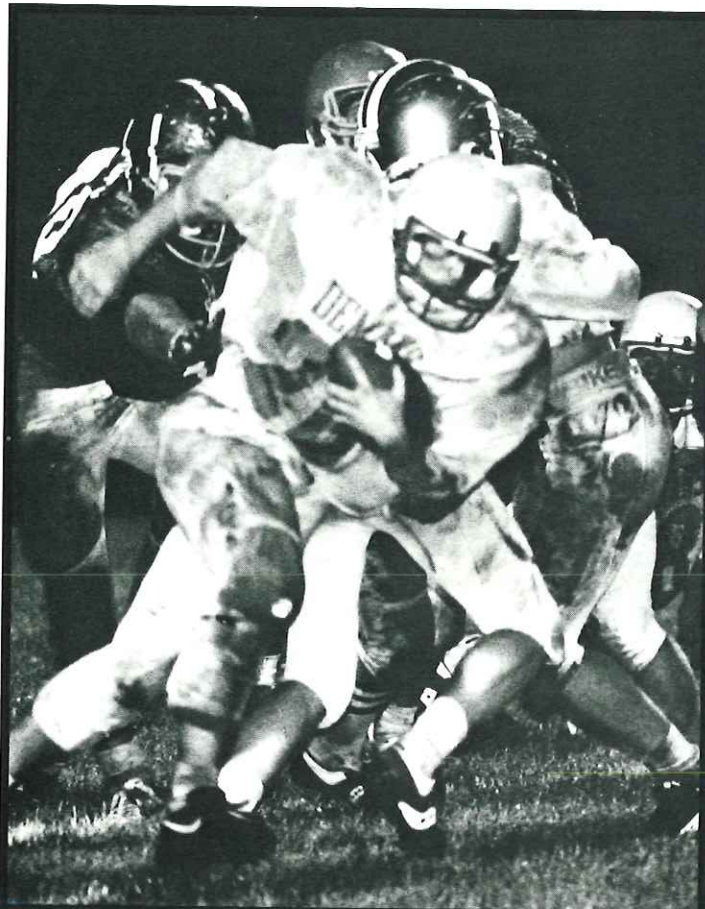
The North's second touchdown with 8:30 left in the game came when Powell scored from the one-foot line.

Powell was the game's leading rusher, picking up 76 yards on 20 carries. Woodring was No. 1 for the South, gaining 62 yards on 18 attempts. The South passed for 156 yards while the North managed only 37 yards through the air.

Irwin caught six passes for 60 yards while Willenbrock had two catches good for 20 yards. The South managed 10 first downs in the mud, two more than the losers.

Don Folmar, P-O's head coach, served as head coach for the North All-Stars.

Goals of the Central Pennsylvania Football Coaches Association, which puts on the game, include providing scholarship funds for worthy area athletes and to showcase Central Pennsylvania scholastic football talent.

# Central Pennsylvania Football Coaches Association

## A Short History

In January 1983, high school coaches interested in promoting scholastic football met to plan an association in the eastern section of District VI. Within three months, thirty five coaches from ten schools were members of the newly established Central Pennsylvania Football Coaches Association (CPFCA).

In the past four years, the CPFCA has grown to include over 130 coaches representing twenty seven schools in the region. Two additional schools, Clearfield and Curwensville, from District IX have joined the association. In its brief history, the association has achieved much in its commitment to "promote scholastic football".

### *Senior Timing Trials*

The Senior Timing Trials are held in State College each August. Seniors run the 40 yard dash and shuttle run, and are tested in the standing long jump. The CPFCA forwards the results to over forty colleges and universities in Pennsylvania and the eastern United States.

### *District VI Playoffs*

During the Summer of 1983 the association sought to develop a regional playoff system and surveyed coaches from Districts V, VI, IX, and X. The interest

was overwhelming; The playoff system was approved in District VI and implemented during the 1985 season.

### *Mid-State Classic*


Two years of preparation went into the establishment of the Mid-State Classic in 1985. The CPFCA provided a format to promote scholastic football, showcase outstanding players and coaches of the region, and develop a scholarship fund. The 1985 Classic produced an exciting game won by the South (14-13) and the association awarded six five hundred dollar scholarships.

### *New Projects*

In association with the 1986 Classic, the CPFCA will sponsor a coaching clinic on Friday, June 20. In addition, the association has purchased video-tapes and manuals on Strength Training, QB & Receiver's Skills and Drills, and Punting and Placekicking techniques. These materials are circulated to the coaches of schools involved in the association.

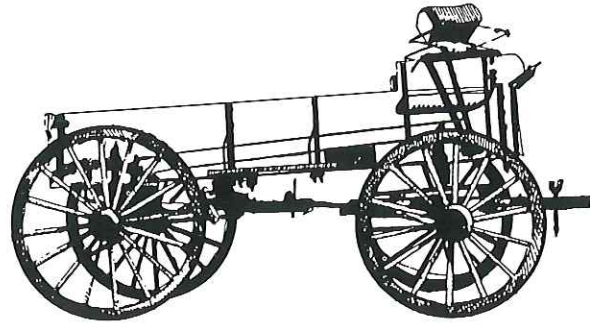

# WHY PLAY IN AN ALL STAR GAME?

During the course of their athletic careers, Bald Eagle Area's Doug Womer and State College's Mark Sherburne have been caught up in one of the area's hottest rivalries. When those two schools square off in anything it tends to get intense.

And there's nothing wrong with that. Rivalries are one of the things that make scholastic sports so intriguing.

So are all-star games. And one of their ripple effects is to bring former antagonists together and allow them to see that the other guy, once he's wearing the same color jersey, in no way fits his former image.

For the most part the athletes already suspect this which is why Womer and Sherburne were both looking forward to the week leading up to tonight's game.

"You get to meet a lot of the guys and it's a chance to compare yourself to them," said Womer, who quarterbacked BEA to an 11-1-1 mark last fall. "Plus, you can just have fun; that's what we're there for."

Sherburne, who was the trigger man for the Little Lions last fall and will be a walk-on at Penn State in August, agrees.

"You get a chance to know a lot of people, to work with people with the same ability you have," he said. "It gives you a chance to compare yourself to the guys beside you."

"And it's also the last chance to play at the high school level before you move on to college."

Seeing the former rivals meld together into a team is also a source of satisfaction for the coaches who work these games.

"During the first day of practice last year you would see three kids from Bellefonte over here, three kids from Philipsburg-Osceola over there and three kids from Lock Haven off by themselves," noted Jack Bailey, who served as an assistant coach a year ago and who is the secretary-treasurer of the Central Pennsylvania Coaches Association. "But by the end of the week they were together. It was a chance to meet 35 other athletes and I know for a fact that some very close friendships developed out of that."

BEA's Gawen Stoker, who will coach the North team tonight, said word of the camaraderie in last year's camp was one of the reasons which prompted Clearfield and Curwensville to accept an invitation to participate after declining a year ago.

"We initially asked them to get involved since they were in on our region," Stoker said. "But they weren't interested. Then, when they saw the enthusiasm that developed and when they saw that it was a first-class operation and not run the way some all-star games are they wanted to be involved."

"Our guys in this region now know they have a chance to play in an all-star game, that they will have a

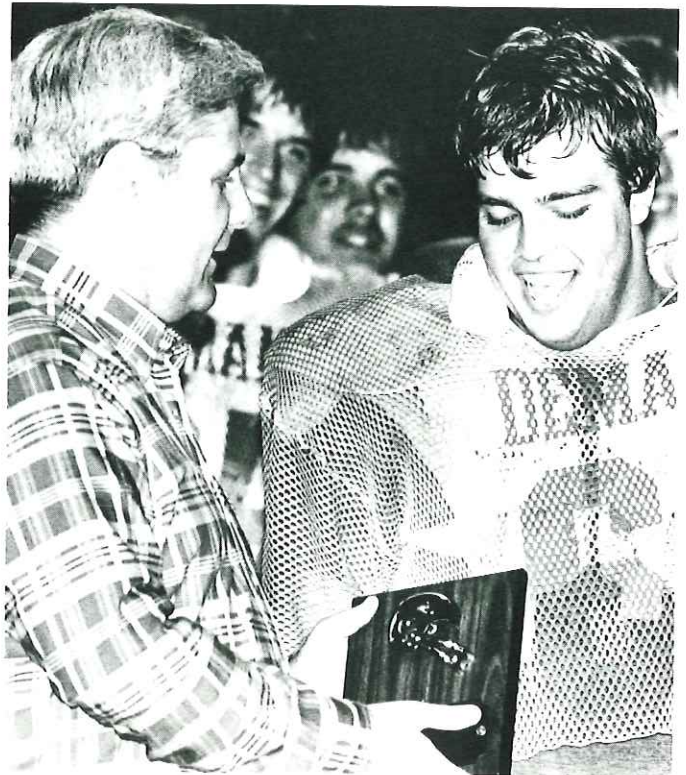
chance to do some things. And the fact that they will get a nice watch and a chance to meet other guys on a friendship basis is just gravy."

But when the whistle blows tonight you can forget about the friendships, the watches and the gravy; the idea is still to win.

"There is a tremendous amount of competitiveness," Stoker continued. "I'm looking forward to another chance at Harold (Price, coach of the South team as well as the Hollidaysburg team which handed BEA its lone loss of the season in the District 6 AAAA semifinals). But you do get a chance to work with some super people you play against all year. We have some great skill people and we want to give them a chance to display their talent."

Price explained that the new friendships are forged in an atmosphere where the emphasis was placed on learning a lot of material in a minimum amount of time.

"There is a lot of teaching involved since you have to put a lot of material in in a short time," he said. "We may have a little live work to make some final decisions but I've learned that when you have a talented group of athletes such as this they pick things up quickly. But the main thing is that they have fun and that at the end of the week they decide that it was worth their time."
