South KOs North In '88 Classic

The South ran over and around the North 49 times for 253 yards in the fourth annual Mid-State Football Classic at Altoona's Mansion Park last June.

The final score had the South the winner by a 28-13 score. The South leads the series by a 3-1 margin going into tonight's game at State College's Memorial Field. The North's only victory came in 1986 when it posted a 29-20 decision at State College.

An excellent performance by the offensive line and the running of Matt Koehle (Bishop Guilfoyle) and Don Fortson (Mount Union) enabled the South to register its second straight win in the series.

Koehle carried 20 times for 172 yards and three touchdowns while Fortson added 90 yards on 23 attempts.

The South (Tom Irwin of Bishop Guilfoyle served as head coach) moved out to a 14-7 lead in the first quarter and left the field at halftime with the score unchanged.

Koehle rambled 65 yards for the game's first TD to make it 6-0.

Dave Domico of Curwensville then scored for the North from close range. The extra point made it 7-6, but that lead didn't last very long.

Mike Cheslock of Altoona intercepted a South pass and returned it 28 yards for a TD. Fortson added a 2-point conversion run and Irwin's team held a 14-7 lead. Cheslock had three interceptions in the game and was named the South's top defensive player while Koehle grabbed the top offensive award.

Koehle scored on a 7-yard TD run to make it 21-7 and then his third touchdown from inside the 1-yard line made it 28-7.

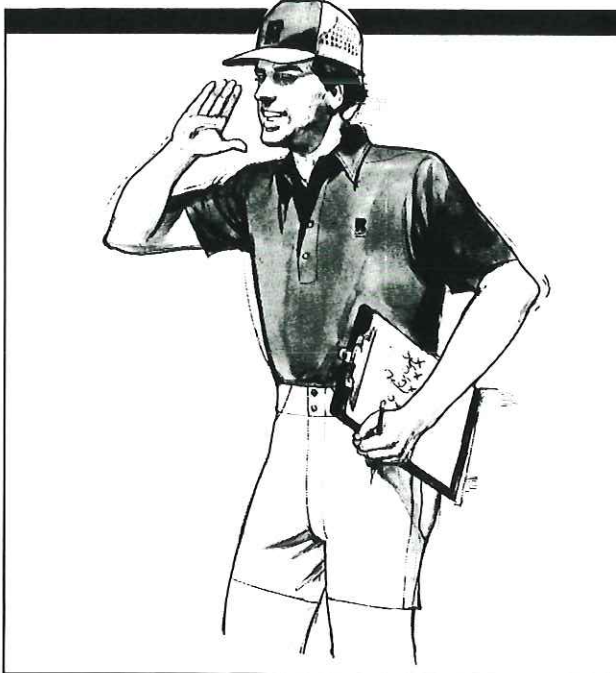
Curwensville's Chris McGarry ended the scoring with a 1-yard TD run.

Tim Fritz of Lock Haven was the top offensive player for the North while Brent Dunmire of Lewistown (two interceptions) earned the top defensive award.

Jack Bailey of Philipsburg-Osceola served as the North's head coach.

THE MID-STATE FOOTBALL CLASSIC

Since 1985 the Mid-State Football Classic has been providing a showcase for central Pennsylvania football talent. This game provides a final opportunity for graduating seniors to take part in a football game with and against opponents from high school years.

The game is administered and organized by the Central Pennsylvania Football Coaches Association with sponsorship and advice of local business leaders. The CPFCA selects coaches, and players, organizes, and promotes the game. Those businesses listed on the program cover support the game not only with advice, but also with significant contributions. The program advertizers, player sponsors, and patrons are essential to the continued support of this game.

Over its first four years the Mid-State Classic Scholarship Committee has awarded 30 scholarships worth \$15,000 to worthy young people. Scholarships are awarded based on student achievement as well as need.

Player Selection

Players are selected for this game by the members of the Central Pennsylvania Football Coaches Association through a multi-step process:

1. Players are nominated in writing in December and January. Each school may nominate no more than five players.
2. Players nominated are polled to ascertain that they will play if selected.
3. Each school's coach is asked to make one "automatic selection." This player will definitely be named for the game.
4. Members of the association select coaching staffs from among schools in each division—North and South.
5. After film review and with advice from the game staff, the balance of the players are selected by consensus of the division selection committee.

Mid-State Football Classic Game Rules

OFFENSIVE RESTRICTIONS:

Must play with balanced line. There must be three men on the line to either side of center. Each team must attempt at least 15 passes during the game.

DEFENSIVE RESTRICTION:

Must align in basic 5-2 with a man on the center, a man on each tackle, a man on each end (or outside the defensive tackle to the side of a split end).

Linebackers must be over the guards and deeper than the heels of the defensive tackles.

Secondary may be man or zone in any desired scheme.

Defensive end (one or both may drop for pass coverage but must start in alignment outside defensive tackle on or off the line. There shall be no blitzing or shooting linebackers or secondary.

SPECIAL FOR KICKING GAME:

In kicking situations the linebackers may move up onto the line of scrimmage, and the secondary may move up (but must stay outside the defensive end); however no more than 7 may rush on any one play.

SPECIAL FOR GOAL-LINE:

Anytime the offense has less than three yards to go for a first down or a touchdown, the linebackers may move as close to the line as desired, and the secondary may place two men on the line (secondary men must be outside the defensive end).

SCORING DIFFERENTIAL RULE:

After a score by either team, a team that is behind by 9 or more points will have the choice to kick-off or receive.

PLAYING TIME:

Each player must participate for at least 15 plays.

TIE-BREAKER:

If the score is tied at the end of regulation play it will stand as a tie.

A Short History And Update

In January 1983, high school football coaches from schools in the central region met to plan a social and educational group. Within three months, thirty-five coaches from ten schools were members of the Central Pennsylvania Football Coaches Association (CPFCA). Over the past five-and-a-half years the CPFCA has grown to include over 200 members representing twenty-eight schools.

MID-STATE FOOTBALL CLASSIC

The Mid-State Football Classic was established in 1985. The CPFCA purpose for this game is threefold - promote football, showcase central Pennsylvania football talent, and raise money for scholarships. Over its first four years the Mid-State Classic has contributed \$15,000 to help thirty young people start post-high school education.

FOOTBALL EDUCATION

The CPFCA sponsors mini-clinics each month, November through May. Speakers from a variety of high school and college situations present current ideas and techniques. Sessions are open at no charge to all members and prospective members.

A major, one-day clinic began this year. The first clinic, held at Lewistown High School, featured PIAA State Champion high school coaches as well as representatives from the "new" college staffs in central Pennsylvania.

The association also provides a library of videotapes and manuals. Subjects covered include Strength Training, QB and Receiver Skills, One-on-one Blocking, and Kicking Techniques. Materials are circulated among the membership. Reservations may be made with Jack Bailey, Secretary.
