# Teamwork leads North to a 7-6 win

ALTOONA — High school all-star football games often showcases offensive talent. Top-notch quarterbacks or dominating running backs can make such contests a personal coming-out party.

But in Friday's Mid-State Classic at Mansion Park, the North proved the value of one well-worn notion.

There is no "I" in team.

Behind 5½ sacks by Penns Valley's Brian Carper and a 14-yard touchdown run by Bucktail's Don Gentzyl, the North outthit and outthusted the South 7-6.

For Penns Valley's Mike Flickinger, the head coach of the North, the upset boiled down to his team playing as a unit.

"We did not have a great deal of skill at the skill positions, but starting Saturday (in the initial practice) I noticed something that really made me happy — they came together as a team. And they played like a team."

In the process, the North defense dulled the shine of the South's marquee players — quarterbacks Steve Taneyhill of Altoona and Jason Elvey of Bishop Guilfoyle.

Taneyhill, coveted by several Division I schools before deciding on South Carolina, completed 9 of 20 passes for 149 yards. The Shippensburg-bound Elvey was 7 of 13 for 105.

Just as important, neither produced a touchdown. The South's only score came on a 93-yard punt return by Punxsutawney's Matt Kemmerer in the first quarter. Andy Conrad's extra point was blocked, which proved to be the difference in the final score.

"Almost everybody (on the North) was from the small schools really out in the woods, out in the boonies," said Gentzyl, who carried 11 times for 57 yards to earn the North's offensive MVP. "We showed the city boys how to play some football."

Especially in the second half, when the North erased a 6-0 deficit and kept the South out of the end zone.

On its first possession of the third quarter, the South coughed up the ball in its own territory when Carper, the North's defensive MVP, recovered tailback Adam Reddinger's fumble at the 33.

Three straight carries by Gentzyl, capped by the 14-yard touchdown burst, knotted the game at 6-6. A successful extra point by State College's Andy Lowery gave the North the lead for good.

"We looked at Gentzyl all week," Flickinger said. "(Seth) Holderman from Bellefonte is a

fantastic back, but we had to shore up our secondary, so we used Holderman there. And Gentzyl just came on like gangbusters."

With the lead in hand, the North used its option attack to milk the clock and its defense to keep Taneyhill, Elvey and company in check.

Penns Valley quarterback Bob McCaffrey was an efficient 8 for 12 for 78 yards through the air and rushed eight times for 31 yards. The North backfield amassed 130 rushing yards, with 93 coming in the second half. The South rushed for minus-3 yards.

"The defense got the momentum going for our offense and we kept driving," said McCaffrey, who'll continue his collegiate career at Old Dominion, where he'll play baseball. "It reminded me a lot of the regular season (at Penns Valley). We lived and died off our defense."

But not until it held off a pair South drives late in the fourth quarter.

With 2:35 left, Elvey moved the South to the North 21. However, Elvey was intercepted by Bellefonte's Brian Egli after West Branch's Jeremy Mondock delivered a big hit to South receiver Jeff Grassmyer.

The South defense forced the North to punt four plays later and Taneyhill took over at his own 42 with 59 seconds remaining.

With 53 seconds left, Taneyhill hit Tyrone's James Weston for a 10-yard gain. After an incompletion, Carper hammered Taneyhill for an 8-yard loss with 25 seconds left. Another incompletion made it 4th-and-10 with six seconds left. Taneyhill's last-gasp bomb was caught by Glendale's Rob Burnmeister at the North 10, but time expired on the play.

Afterward, Flickinger reflected on how his team came together.

"We really preached hard about being tough the whole week. That's one of the things we did. We hit hard from the first day. I had to tell them to stop hitting."

**NOTES:** Kemmerer caught five passes for 78 yards on his way to South offensive MVP honors. Bellwood-Antis' Karl Montanaro and Punxsutawney's Bret Rankin shared the defensive MVP honors for the South. . . . Bellefonte's Chris Rogers led the North with five catches for 61 yards. . . . Noah Gustkey of Philipsburg-Osceola rushed seven times for 19 yards. Penns Valley's Brad Zettle carried seven times for 16 yards. Chris Dry of State College rushed once for four yards. Holderman carried once for no gain. . . . Lowery's 32-yard field goal in the second quarter was called back because of an illegal formation penalty. His subsequent 37-yarder fell short.

# MID-STATE 1993 CLASSIC HISTORY

On August 6, 1960, the Central Counties Conference All-Star game was played at Bellefonte. Forty-three players representing 14 schools participated. This seems to have been the first All-Star football game for Central Pennsylvania. It was sponsored entirely by Bellefonte Area Businesses to raise money for the YMCA and the Community Betterment Fund.

In 1977 and again in 1978, the Lewis-town Area Lions Club sponsored a regional All-Star game that involved Blair, Centre, Clinton, and Huntingdon county schools. Those were "great football games" but less than successful financially.

The Central Pennsylvania Football Coaches Association membership instituted the Mid-State Football Classic in 1985. This game was initiated to promote football, to recognize excellence in regional football performance, and to fund a program of scholarships and ongoing football education.

To date \$26,000 in the form of 52 scholarships has been awarded to help young people continue their educations. The CPFCA holds monthly mini-clinics for high school and youth league coaches. Players talk about playing in the Mid-State Football Classic as they prepare for their senior seasons. It would seem that the goals are being approached.

The degree to which the game and the CPFCA can work toward these goals will depend upon the support we continue to receive. Our gratitude is extended to our co-sponsors and business advertisers, to individual player sponsors and patrons, and to football fans. You make it all work!

## Player Selection

Players are selected for this game by the members of the Central Pennsylvania Football Coaches Association through a multi-step process:

1. Players are nominated in writing in December and January. Each school may have no more than five players participate.
2. Players nominated are polled to ascertain that they will play if selected.
3. Each school's coach is asked to make one "automatic selection." This player will definitely be named for the game.
4. Members of the association select coaching staffs from among schools in each division—North and South.
5. After film review and with advice from the game staff, the balance of the players are selected by consensus of the division selection committee.

# MID-STATE FOOTBALL CLASSIC GAME RULES

## OFFENSIVE RESTRICTIONS:

Must play with balanced line. There must be three men on either side of center. The offense may not align in trips, but motion is permitted.

Each team must attempt passes at least 30% of the offensive plays. Percentages will be checked midway through the third quarter. If under the 30% passes have been thrown, each non-pass play will be penalized as unsportsman-like conduct until the percentage is met and at least held.

## DEFENSIVE RESTRICTIONS

Must align in basic 5-2 with a man on the center, a man on each tackle, a man on each end (or outside the defensive tackle on a split end side).

Linebackers must be over the guards and deeper than the heels of the defensive tackles.

Secondary may be man or zone in any desired scheme.

Defensive end (one or both may drop for pass coverage but must start in alignment outside defensive tackle on or off the line. There shall be no blitzing or shooting linebackers or secondary.

## SPECIAL FOR KICKING GAME

In kicking situations the linebackers may move up onto the line of scrimmage, and the secondary may move up (but must stay outside the defensive end); however, no more than 7 may rush on any one play.

## SPECIAL FOR GOAL-LINE

Anytime the offense has less than three yards to go for a first down or a touchdown, the linebackers may move as close to the line as desired, and the secondary may place two men on the line (secondary men must be outside the defensive end.)

## SCORING DIFFERENTIAL RULE:

After a score by either team, a team that is behind by 9 or more points will have the choice to kick-off or receive.

## PLAYING TIME:

Each player must participate for at least 15 plays.

## TIE-BREAKER:

If the score is tied at the end of regulation play it will stand as a tie.

## Who Does It And Where Does It Go?

There are valid questions frequently asked about all-star games and non-profit organizations. How are receipts from the game used? Who gets paid and who donates products and services? Why does it cost so much? Although these inquiries are usually directed to the game management, they have already been asked by the game management.

The expenses of conducting the game are significant. Insurance, stadium rental and game personnel, mementos for the players and coaches, and mailing and information distribution costs all must be paid. The CPFCA has established a goal to award at least six \$500 scholarships annually. Whenever good attendance or special sponsorships permit, the number of scholarships is increased.

The Big 33 Scholarship Foundation, Inc. is a recognized, tax exempt, non-profit organization that administers over 100 scholarships each year. The CPFCA has decided to have this foundation issue the Mid-State Classic Scholarships to serve as an additional safeguard for our own tax exempt status, and an additional check that funds are distributed and credited in the proper manner. This service is at no cost to us.

No travel reimbursements, housing, or other individual expenses are paid by the game. The players, coaches and others involved are doing things because they want to help. Most football people believe they owe to the game something for what they have gotten from it. While it would be difficult to adequately describe either what one gets or how it is paid back, the Classic gives many an opportunity to help.
