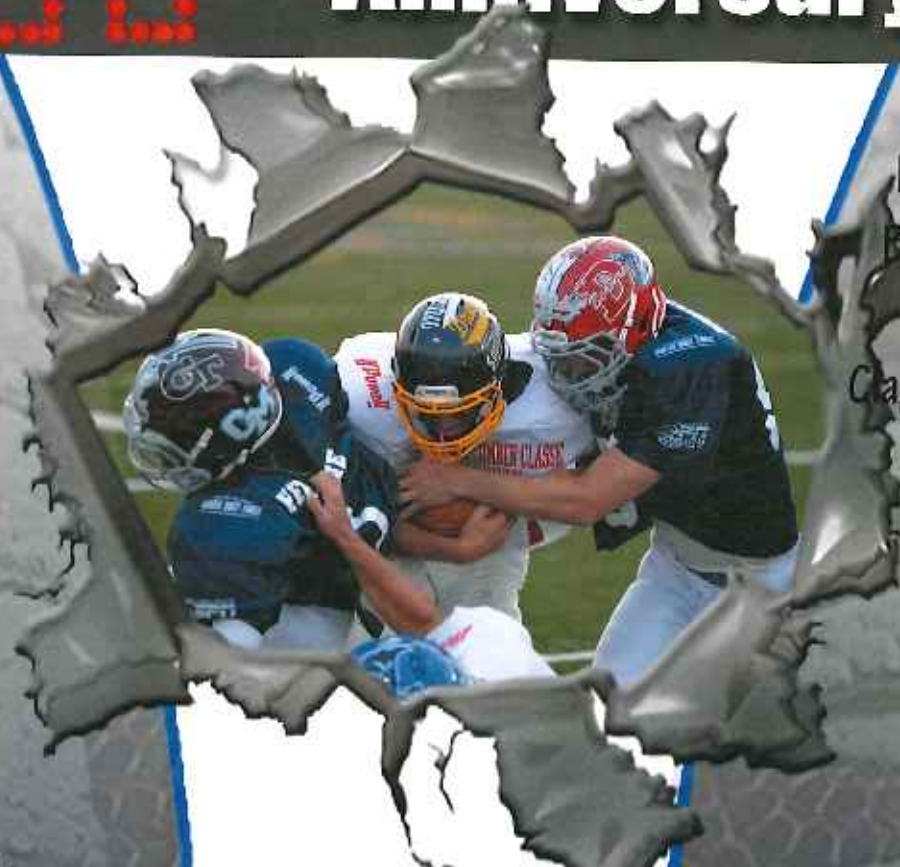

Tom Shearer (Indian Valley)

Coach Shearer started his coaching career in the late 1980's when Indian Valley High School opened. For several of those beginning years he was a long-time adversary and then an assistant coach to Gawen Stoker. Tom took over the head coaching position in 2008 until the Lewistown and Indian Valley merged into Mifflin County High School. Upon the passing of Gawen Stoker in 2011, Tom took on the responsibilities of organizing the CPFCA Prospect Camp that is held annually. The past May he had approximately 400 student-athletes participate in the combine held at Bald Eagle Area HS. Over 70 high school coaches from the association attended along with 25 Pennsylvania college coaches. Tom is a Technology Education faculty member at Mifflin County HS. Tom was the Head Coach for the South squad in 2009 and assisted in 2010. Currently, Tom is an assistant coach on the Penns Valley staff.

Forrest Campman (Clearfield)

Forrest Dean Campman is the son of Albert Campman and Lois Dunkerly of Wheatland, PA. He attended Farrell High School where he was the starting quarterback for the Steelers 1976 WPIAL champion football team. He was also a member of the 1974 WPIAL champion basketball team. Upon graduation Forrest received an athletic scholarship to Westminster College where he was a member of the 1977 NAIA National Championship football team. While at Westminster he was also a pitcher on the Titans baseball team. During his time in school he studied history while earning a teachers certification. He then accepted a teaching position at Clearfield Area High School as a Civics teacher as well as assistant football coach and freshman basketball coach. Campman was a fixture on the Bison sidelines for 32 seasons where he orchestrated the defense until his retirement in 2014. During his time as the Clearfield defensive coordinator he helped the Bison reach numerous school milestones including 12 District 9 Championships alongside Head Coach Tim Janocko. Forrest also assumed the position of head basketball coach for the Bison in 2002. During his tenure as the basketball coach he guided his teams to over 120 wins and 5 District 9 title game appearances and 3 state playoff berths including a District 9 Championship trophy in 2009.

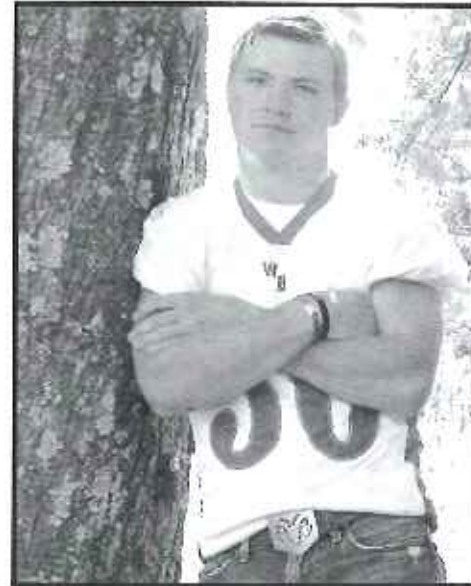

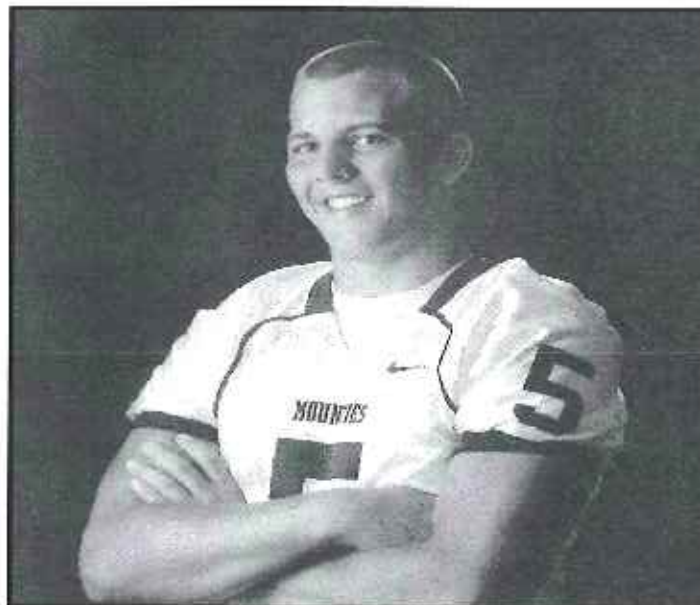

Safteties with Numbers

State College's Herculane, Fry help North to rout over South Squad

WINGATE — In the span of a week, a group of players from across the region — many of whom had never played on the same team before — became a smooth-running, hard-hitting, ball-hawking cohesive unit.

A pair of State College defensive backs had a lot to do with that.

Darian Herculane and Dan Fry played their final high school football game together surrounded by new faces in Friday's 29th Lezzer Lumber Classic where the pair of Little Lion defensive backs helped lead the North to a 49-27 win at Alumni Stadium in Wingate.

With other locals — Bald Eagle Area's Cole Long and Jon Romine, Bellefonte's Dan Roan, Penns Valley's Zach Harter and Scott Johnson, Philipsburg-Osceola's Brian Matthews and State College's Troy Peterson and Mike Rizzuto — at their sides, Herculane and Fry combined for six tackles, two interceptions and led a North secondary that stymied a South passing attack as the game, co-sponsored by the Centre Daily Times, wore on.

The 29th Lezzer Lumber Classic featured a strict set of rules that prohibited blitzing and forced offenses to pass at least 30 percent of the time. That second criterion appealed to Herculane and Fry, who patrolled deep portions of the Alumni Stadium turf.

"In a regular game, a team can just be running, running, running, but in this game they have to pass it," Fry said. "So it's just something that sticks in your mind and makes you think that the pass is coming. It keeps you more on your toes for the pass."

The first quarter was back-and-forth and momentum swung wildly both ways.

The North took an easy 7-0 lead on three plays when Central Mountain's Von Walker followed up a 41-yard completion to Clearfield's Trey Jordan with a nine-yard touchdown run of his own. The North was gifted two points when a long snap sailed over punter Josh Kutz's head and into the end zone where Kutz gave chase and booted it out of bounds for a safety to avoid giving up a touchdown.

But the North couldn't take advantage of good field position provided by a 23-yard Herculane return on the free kick.

Instead, Glendale's Damon Braniff fumbled immediately thereafter and South lineman Josh Kutz of Altoona scooped it up and rumbled 55 yards to cut the North's lead to 9-7.

After the North marched 39 yards to set up Phil Esposito's 23-yard field goal, the South was able to get its offense going. Coached by Hollidaysburg's John Barton, the South rang up a 13-play, 70-yard scoring drive that ended on a one-yard run from Hollidaysburg quarterback Brian Urban.

But the North came back on the arm of a hometown favorite. Another sharp return, this one from Glendale's Douge Twigg set the North up on the South's 27-yard-line. The drive initially stalled following a holding call. That didn't deter BEA quarterback Long, who rifled a 22-yard pass to Jordan to retake the lead.

Long, who was awarded a scholarship from the Pennsylvania Football Coaches Association following the game, was all smiles afterward.

"It was a post-wheel play and the corner sat and the safety drifted over on the wheel route, so they doubleteamed the wheel route and it was open on the post," Long said. "It meant a lot because a lot of my family was able to come to it and they tailgated before and had a good time."

The South clawed its way back down the field where Urban hooked up with Blake Davis on a 25-yard passing touchdown to open the second quarter. Fry would kill any momentum the South had after that, however.

After a North punt, the South ran four plays and was helped by a pass interference penalty. But as the South offense maneuvered into North territory, Fry spied an overthrown pass from Urban, spun on his heels and snagged the ball out of the air.

"When I saw the ball in the air I wasn't sure if it was going to go over his head or at him so my thought was, either I was going to hit him or pick it off," Fry said. "He threw it too far and I was right there to grab it."

The North would turn Fry's pick into points as Braniff finished a five-play drive with a 17-yard dash to the endzone.

"It took all the air out of their sails," North coach Michael Keith said of Fry's interception.

Late in the third, Urban was intercepted again. This time it wasn't a speedy defensive back, though. Instead, Brockway lineman Matt Snyder swiped a screen pass try out of the air at midfield. Walker, who was named the North's offensive MVP for his 219 total yards, needed just one play to effectively end the South's night.

The soon-to-be Penn State run-on aired a 50-yard touchdown pass to an uncovered Jared Baummer to give the North a 35-21 lead with just over three minutes to play. Walker added a 55-yard touchdown pass to Garret Brown on the first play of the fourth quarter.

The South's comeback attempt was belcagured by two personal foul penalties and another interception from Fry. A solid return was negated by an unsportsmanlike penalty on the South's ensuing drive. After forcing a North punt, the South tried a halfback option pass that Fry sniffed out and intercepted. On its next drive, the South was hit again with a flag after Altoona's Charles Wilson-Adams spoiled his 39-yard catch with a taunting gesture that drew another 15-yard penalty.

He'd make up for it with a 12-yard touchdown catch with 5:04 to go but Walker added an eight-yard touchdown run to cap the scoring.

"They're easy to coach, they're great to coach and we had a great group," Keith said of the North. "They were fun, gentlemen and they're going to do well in the future."

Notes: Fry was named North defensive MVP. ... Urban earned the South's offensive MVP nod while Matt Barton was defensive MVP. ... The winner of the 50-50 drawing pocketed over 600 dollars ... Rizzuto left the game with a left leg injury in the first quarter and did not return to the game.

He was persistent. He was loyal. But most of all he was a friend of Pennsylvania High School football. "Stokes" was involved in football across the State. He was an active member of the Pennsylvania Scholastic Football Coaches' Association. He was a major partner in the Lezzer Lumber All-Star Game and he was extremely active in the District 6 Football Coaches' Association. As a member of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame (PA Chapter), Gawen was one of the hardest workers on the Board. He was proud of the area athletes who distinguished themselves on the field and in the classroom. Stokes made a name for himself as an innovator in

high school football, perhaps being the first to bring the 'polecat' to our area. He coached at Bald Eagle Area, Trinity (Washington, PA) and more recently at Indian Valley High School (now part of the Mifflin County jointure).

Frank Rocco, executive director of the Central PA Chapter says, "J. Gawen Stoker was a leader of men and boys and a great friend to many, many people. As Executive Director of the Pa. How are the funds raised? Where does the money go?

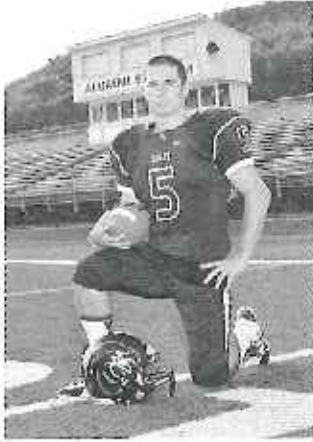
The Central Pennsylvania Football Coaches Association (CPFCA) is recognized as a non-profit organization. The CPFCA has been the administrative organization promoting and conducting the Classic over the past twenty-four years. Annually the receipts and expenditures for the operation of the game are in the \$25,000 to \$30,000 range.

There are three avenues of revenue for the Classic -- 1) individual player sponsors provide for one-third of the funds, 2) Game Sponsor and Co-Sponsors contributions equate to one-fourth of the revenue, and 3) the promotional component, including advertisers, business card and patron sponsors, sale of promotional items such as hats, T-shirts, and game program, video, and ticket sales constitutes the remainder of the revenues.

On the expenditure side, player expenses including game jerseys, practice meals, player commemorative awards, insurance coverage, and scholarship awards account for forty percent of the costs. An additional forty percent of the expenses are related to field rental, game site personnel, purchase of promotional items, and game program printing costs. The rest of the expenses are associated with coaching expenses, promotional fees, and administrative costs.

Basically, the game is a result of efforts of individuals from the thirty-one schools comprising the Central Pennsylvania region working for continued success of the Lezzer Lumber Classic.

A Classic History

Previous Central Pennsylvania All-Star Football games such as the 1960 Central Counties and the 1977-78 Lewisburg Lion Club were "great football games," but were short lived.

In 1985, the Central Pennsylvania Football Coaches Association, with J. Gawen Stoker as the Game Director, initiated the Mid-State Classic under the corporate sponsorship of the Mid-State Bank. The game was established to promote scholastic football, to recognize excellence of our players and coaches, to provide a system of ongoing football education for our coaching staffs, and to fund a scholarship program. The first game involved players from twenty-five schools. Uni-Mart replaced Mid-State Bank as the game sponsor in 1993. Since 1996, Jack Bailey and Bob Irwin have served as Co-Game Directors for the Classic. J. Gawen Stoker is our Game Director for 2010.

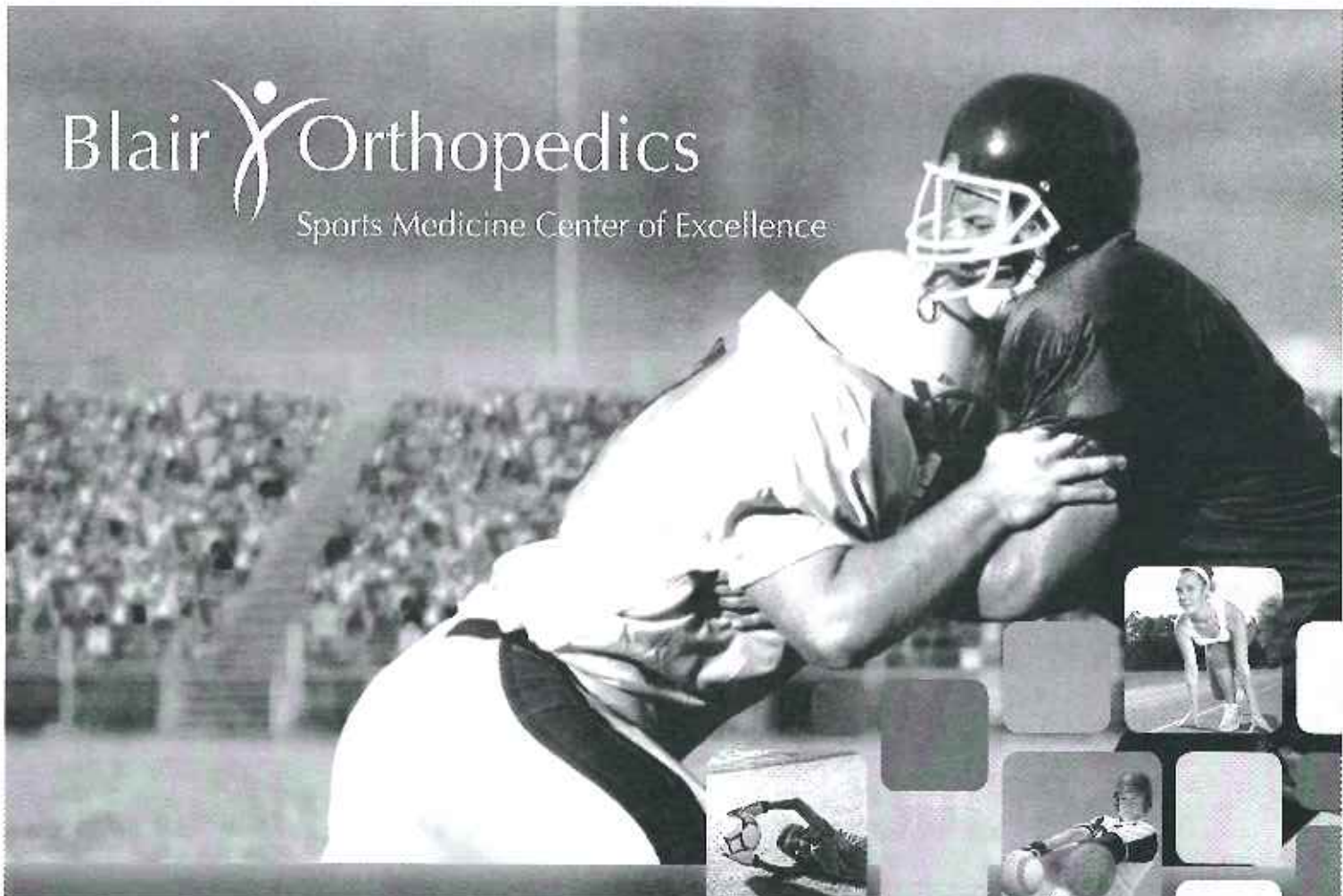
In 1998, the Lezzer Lumber Company became the major sponsor for the Classic with the CPFCA maintaining the football and organizational aspects of the game. We are proud to continue our association with the Lezzer Lumber as the corporate sponsor. Currently, there are thirty-one schools from District VI and IX involved in the game. To date, \$118,000 in the form of 228 scholarships have been awarded to help young people continue their education. The CPFCA holds monthly mini-clinics for high school and youth coaches during the winter months. To the players and coaches, being selected to participate in the "Classic" is held in high regard. It would seem that the goals for the Classic are being realized. The degree to which the game and the CPFCA can work toward these goals will depend upon the support we continue to receive.

It is a tribute to our sponsors and co-sponsors, to the individual players sponsors, the business card and patron sponsors, and to families and friends of scholastic football in the Central Pennsylvania region. Player Profiles from the 2004 Lezzer Lumber Classic

North: Mickey Rehring, State College

Mickey graduated from F & M. Played football all four years. Assistant football coach at Bowdin College. Presently defensive coordinator at Johns Hopkins University. Taking over as the Blue Jays' defensive coordinator this season is Mickey Rehring, who is in his second season as a member of head coach Jim Margraff's staff. Rehring joined the staff last season and coached the JHU linebackers while also serving as the special teams coordinator.

Rehring wasted little time making an impact on the Blue Jay defense as he coached senior linebacker Taylor Maciow to Centennial Conference Defensive Player of the Year honors. The Blue Jay defense ranked among the top 40 in the nation in rushing, scoring and total defense while also ranking 14th in sacks.

Rehring came to Johns Hopkins after a three-year stint as an assistant coach at Bowdoin (ME), where he coached the Polar Bear defensive line and also served as the special teams coach. Rehring's defensive line fueled a Bowdoin defense that ranked among the nation's best in 2011. The Polar Bears finished in the top 50 nationally in five different statistical categories that year, including 16th in total defense, 19th in passing yards allowed per game and 21st in scoring defense.

Rehring arrived at Homewood with an extensive familiarity with the Centennial Conference as he played four years of college football at Franklin & Marshall. He was a four-year starter for the Diplomats on the defensive line and earned Second Team All-Centennial honors as a sophomore. Rehring helped guide the Diplomats to a share of the 2004 Centennial Conference title and the 2004 ECAC Southwest Championship as well. F&M also advanced to the ECAC Southeast Bowl in 2005 and Rehring concluded his career with 133 tackles, 15.5 tackles for losses and 8.5 sacks.

South: Jon Baker, Lewistown:

Jon attended Shippensburg University for two years and Susquehanna University for two years and played football all four years. He received his Bachelor's degree from Susquehanna in Business and Finance.

He is currently employed by Geisinger Hospital in Lewistown working as Coordinator of Financial Decision Support System Data and Reporting. This involves providing accurate and timely operations and statistical analysis support to management. It also entails providing decision support education to management and staff.

He also serves as the Linebackers Coach for Mifflin County High School football team. Jon is married and has one child. They reside in Lewistown.

LEZZER LUMBER FOOTBALL CLASSIC GAME

Offense	Must play with a balanced line. There must be three men on either side of center on the line of scrimmage. The offense may align in or motion to trips formation as long as one running back remains aligned in the backfield between the tackles. Each team must attempt passes on 30 % of their offensive plays. Percentages will be checked midway through the third quarter. If a team is under the 30 % pass attempt, each non-pass play will be penalized for unsportsmanlike conduct until the percentages are met and maintained. Forced scrambles and sacks will be counted as pass attempts
Defense	Must align in a Basic 5-2, with a man on the Center, a man on each Tackle, and a man on each End (or outside of the defensive tackle to the split-end side) Linebackers must be over the Guards and deeper than the heels of the defensive tackles. Defensive Ends (one or both may drop into pass coverage) but must start in alignment outside the defensive tackles, on or off the ball. Slanting and looping by the front five is permissible. There shall be no blitzing or shooting of linebackers or secondary. Pass Coverage on first, second, and fourth down may be man or zone, but must be man-to-man on third down.
Short Yardage / Goaline	Anytime the offense has less than three yards to go for a first down or touchdown, the linebackers may move up unto the line of scrimmage, and the secondary may move up (but must stay outside the defensive end).
Point Differential	<u>If Team A scores and is behind by 9 + points, Team A will be given the Option to Kick or Receive. If Team A receives and scores on that possession and still trails by 9 + points, No option - Team A will Kickoff to Team B. Rule does not change designated second half Kickoff.</u>
Kickoff	<u>Kickoff will be from the 35 yardline.</u>
Kicking Game	In Kicking Game situations, the linebackers may move up unto the line of scrimmage, and the secondary may move up (but must stay outside the defensive end), however, no more than seven may rush on any kicking play.
Quarters / Time	Each <u>Quarter will be 12 minutes</u>
Playing Time	Each player must participate for a least 15 plays.
Tie Breaker	If the score is tied at the end of regulation play it will stand as a tie

PLAYER AND COACHES SELECTION

Players and coaches are selected for the game by members of the Central Pennsylvania Football Coaches Association. They require that a representative attend a minimum of three CPFCA meetings before a player is eligible. Players from schools failing to meet the minimum participation requirements are not eligible for the following year.

Player Selection:

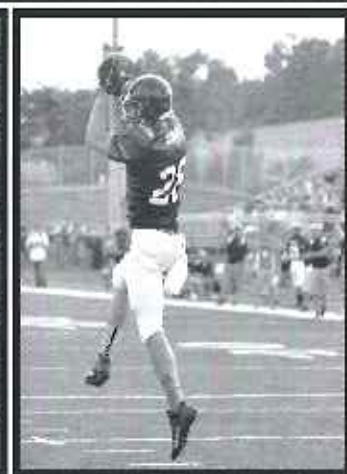
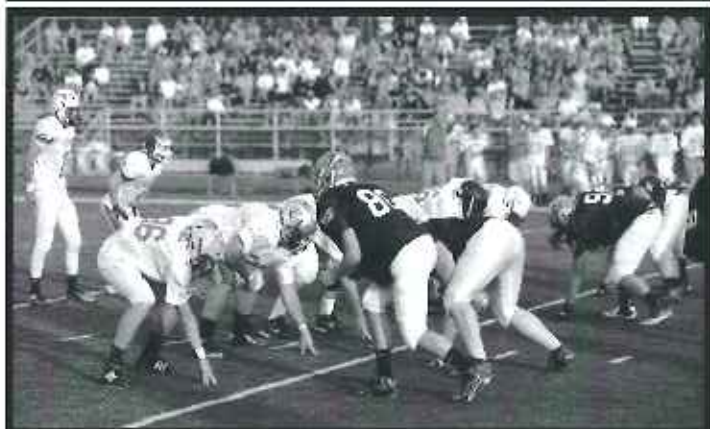
1. Graduating Senior players are nominated in writing by their head coach in December.
 - a. Each school may have no more than five players participate.
2. Players nominated are polled to ascertain that they will participate if selected.
3. Coaches from schools in each division review the nominated players and the forty players are selected by a consensus of the selection committees. (A player from each eligible school will be selected to participate in the game.)
4. This year coaches from both staffs selected alternates in case players were unable to participate for various reasons.

Coach Selection:

1. Members of the association select the coaching staff from member schools in each division -- North and South.
2. The coaching staffs for each division consist of a Head Coach and five/six Associate Coaches.

CPFCA Remembers Frank Baker



Frank Baker, longtime coach at Southern Huntingdon High, lost a health battle at the Hershey Medical Center on November 1st, 2013. Frank was one of the “good guys” in this fraternity of high school coaches. As a colleague, Frank was a very approachable coach, whether he was on your sideline or across the field.

Frank retired from teaching in 2006 but stayed “high profile” among the coaches through some time assisting at Huntingdon or attending occasional CPFCA meetings in Tyrone. Frank was inducted into the Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2004.

In 1971, Frank began his teaching career and jumped right into coaching assisting famed Southern Huntingdon Head Football Coach, Ted Nypaver. He definitely paid his dues through the seventies and eighties when finally his opportunity came ringing in 1994 when he was named Head Football Coach at Southern. Frank won 57% of his games and was very well-liked by his players. He was very committed to the Rockets’ athletic programs having coached Wrestling for 20 years and Track and Field for 8 years just as Head Coach. One can throw a few more years onto those statistics as an assistant coach.

In 2003, Frank and Rose moved from the southern end of Huntingdon County to Houserville, just outside of State College. Frank would leave Orbisonia after school and drive home through Huntingdon. Frank decided since he’s driving through Huntingdon, he could jump on the Bearcat staff as a defensive coach. He held that position with Huntingdon’s coach, Jim Zauzig, from 2003-2008.

During Frank’s tenure as a football coach, he was selected several times as either a Head Coach or an assistant coach of the LEZZER LUMBER game. Big Frank enjoyed golfing, playing poker, gardening and the outdoor life-style. Frank loved the sport of football and it showed over the years with his participation in Association events. He was never afraid to “step up to the plate” when needed.

Frank’s wife, Rose, still resides in Houserville. He left behind a daughter (Francie) and four boys (Jason, Andrew, Josh and Daniel Trew). Frank, who passed away at the age of 66, will also be missed by 6 grandchildren. The C.P.F.C.A. would like to “tip our hat” to the life of Frank Baker.

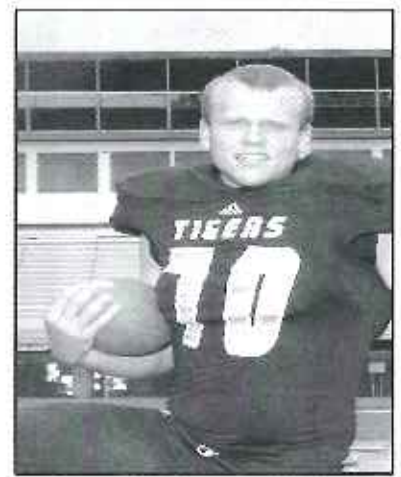

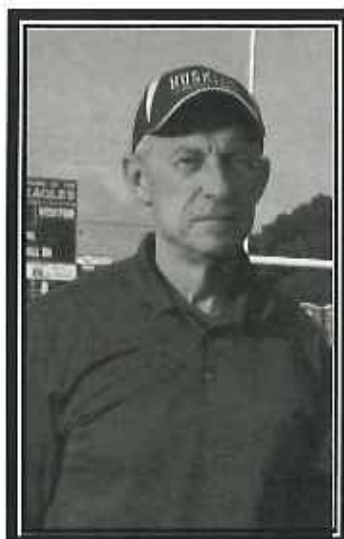

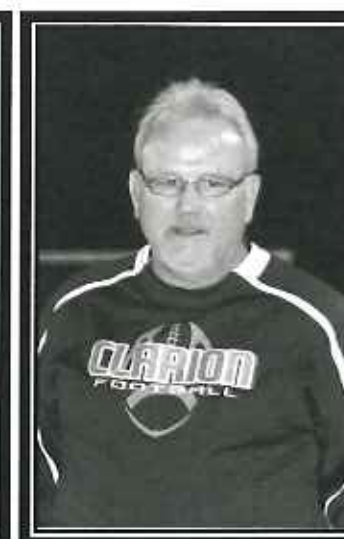
